GOODWIN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Dear Parents,

September 20, 2019

Your child has Physical Education class three days a week (Preschool and Kindergarten once a week) for thirty minutes each period. It is very important for your child to have the proper footwear to safely participate in the various motor activities presented. Sneakers that support the ankle and the arch of the foot are required; they need to have either laces or Velcro to enable your child to safely participate in Physical Education. Slip-on shoes (the ones with no laces), open back shoes, sneakers with openings are examples of sneakers that are not appropriate for physical education activities. There have been several students who have been injured due to improper footwear and or sneakers that were not properly tied.

Each day, students in grades one through four participate in a physical fitness routine to start class. We begin each Physical Education class by running to exercise our hearts, then we stretch our legs and lower backs, we do curl ups for stomach strength and endurance and finish with push ups for upper body strength and endurance. Students need to come to physical education prepared to participate in the fitness routine and activity.

Please remind your child to wear and tie their sneakers on the days that they have P.E. class. Below is the Physical Education schedule for the 2019-20 school year. Thank you for your assistance.

2019 YOUTH BASKETBALL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Registration Deadlines: Travel Division (10/1) Grades 3-8 recreation division (10/14) K-2 (12/1)

Mansfield Parks and Recreation Basketball welcomes players at all levels of experience. The program features skill development, sportsmanship, team participation and healthy competition for grades K-8. Practices for most divisions begin in November with game play December – February. Practice and game schedules determined after teams are formed. Volunteer head and assistant coaches are needed for most divisions. Must be a minimum of 18 years of age. All vacant positions are by application. If needed, a brief verbal interview may be required. Parent helpers are also needed for grades K-2.

*Complete and return participant registration form and note registration deadlines. Registration after deadline dates will only be accepted if space is still available and with a \$20.00 late fee per participant. See information on mandatory tryout and evaluation dates/times per division for grades 3-8.

(Grades K-1) Little Huskies Division, \$60.00, \$70.00 non-residents. 8 sessions, 12/14-2/8 (no 12/28).

#341001-A (9:00am-9:55am) #341001-B 10:00am-10:55am An instructional, co-ed program that introduces the fundamentals of basketball using a variety of fun drills and activities designed to progressively improve skills and general knowledge of the sport. Location: Local schools. Register for 1 of 2 section offerings. Bring own 25.5-27.5 basketball.

(Grade 2) Junior Huskies Division, \$60.00, \$70.00 non-residents. 8 sessions, 12/14-2/8 (no 12/28).

(#341002-A 11:15-12:30), #341002-B (12:45-2:00). Fundamental basketball skill development and modified (3V3, 4V4) co-ed teams modified game play in a supportive environment. Staff will provide a combination of instructional drills and games. Modified games the last portion of season. Saturday morning/early afternoons at local schools. Register for 1 of 2 sections.

(Grades 3 & 4) Instructional Division, Begins with evaluations and concludes in late February. \$75.00,

\$85.00 non-residents, #341005-A (girls) #341006-A (boys). Separate teams for boys and girls will be formed after the mandatory division player evaluation day with the objective to keep teams fair and balanced. All participants will be placed on a team and with equal playing time. Requests for specific coaches, teammates or carpools are not accepted. Practices and games are used for opportunities of fundamental skill development in an encouraging and supportive environment. Coaches and officials will instruct play as needed to help players learn rules, develop good sportsmanship, and allow for healthy competition. Practices are weeknights and games are held (primarily) on Saturdays and include traveling to local towns Saturday games including traveling to local towns of Coventry/Ashford/Hebron/Bolton/Willington. The season ends between 2/15-2/23.

Grades 5 & 6 and Grades 7 & 8 Program Options. Begins with October tryouts (competitive/travel) or player evaluations (recreation) and concludes in late February. See registration numbers on evaluation date page.

Players in grades 5 & 6 and 7 & 8 have two options for play. Participate in the recreation division OR tryout out for limited space on a higher commitment level competitive/travel team.

Recreation 5&6, 7&8 teams \$100.00, \$110.00 non-residents. Teams formed after the mandatory division player evaluation day with the objective to keep teams fair and balanced. All participants will be placed on a team and with equal playing time. Requests for specific coaches or teammates are not accepted. Practices and games are used for opportunities of fundamental skill development and healthy competition in an encouraging and supportive environment. Practices are weeknights and (primarily) Saturday games including traveling to local towns of Coventry/Ashford/Hebron/Bolton/Willington. The season ends between 2/15-2/23.

Competitive/Travel teams \$215.00 (Mansfield residents only). Teams are grades 5&6 and 7&8 unless there are sufficient numbers allow for same grade teams. Requires an increased commitment to practices and games. Players are expected to consistently attend practices and games and participate in rigorous game preparation and game play. The season begins with tryouts in October and concludes with tournament play in March. While emphasis is still on progressive skill development and good sportsmanship, teams are limited to 8-10 players and placement must be earned each season by attending a mandatory tryout and being selected for a team. Team selection is determined by MPRD staff and coaches. Regardless of a previous year team placement all players are required to attend the scheduled annual tryout date to be considered for teams. Special requests for an alternate tryout must be made prior to registration deadline date. Staff will make decisions on special requests. This division includes participation in the North Central Connecticut Travel Basketball League. Visit nccball.org.



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


