
DESIGN

Did T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Week effect student's understanding and implementation of Internet and phone safety at Mansfield Middle School?

ASK


Fifth and eighth grade students took a pre-test before the start of the T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Curriculum and took the post-test the Monday following T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Week. This will see what they learned and took away from the Internet Safety Assembly, Green Dot Lesson, T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Worksheet, T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Bingo Cards, T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Bulletin Board, T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Flyers, T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Morning and Afternoon Announcements, and T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Prizes.

As a result of T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Week 8th graders:

- Received less messages over the Internet that made them feel uncomfortable (19.3% to 8.4%)
- Sent less messages over the Internet that made others feel uncomfortable (11.2% to 3.1%)
- Were better able to recognize an example of an inappropriate online exchange (42.1% to 95.4%)
- 99% of 8th Graders know it is not safe to share their personal information with individuals they do not know over the Internet
- 90% of 8th Graders know it is not safe to be friends on Facebook with an individual they do not know personally
- 95% of 8th Graders know it is not okay to say hurtful things over the Internet



As a result of T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Week 5th graders:

- 79% of 5th Graders agreed or strongly agreed that they liked T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Week
- 97% of 5th Graders know it is not safe to share personal information with individuals they do not know over the Internet.
- 98% of 5th Graders know it is not safe to be friends on Facebook with an individual they do not know personally
- 100% of 5th Graders know it is not okay to say hurtful things to others over the Internet
- 95% of 5th Graders have NOT seen inappropriate online exchanges by their classmates in the past two weeks

Implications and Recommendations:

- A majority of 5th and 8th grade students agreed or strongly agreed that they liked T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post Week therefore the School Counseling department could use this topic/theme in future Positive Behavior Recognition weeks.
- Recommendations by students: do more T.H.I.N.K. B4 U Post activities during A/A, after school and during X-block; have it be longer than one week; more emphasis on dangers of not thinking before you post; more teacher enforcement of green dots; more advertisement of the week
- The recommendations by students will be taken into account during future Positive Behavior Recognition Week planning.

These findings will be shared with MMS teachers, administrators, and staff.
