Budget 2013-2014 Decisions

On Tuesday, May 14, 2013, the Town of Mansfield held its Annual Town Meeting for Budget Consideration. At the meeting, the Town Council presented its proposed budgets for Fiscal Year 2013/14: General Fund budget of \$45,488,844 (including the Region 19 contribution of \$10,005,514), a Capital Fund budget of \$2,285,290 and a Capital Nonrecurring Fund (CNR) budget of \$1,194,860.

There was an amendment to the General Fund budget to add \$200,000 to the Board of Education budget. The motion was seconded, and passed on a voice vote. Following that, a vote on the resolutions to adopt the budget was conducted by paper ballot. The voters at Town Meeting adopted the proposed budget as amended, with 151 in favor and 37 opposed.

After a successful petition was filed for a referendum on the budget (as amended at the Annual Town Meeting), a town wide referendum was held on Tuesday, June 18.

The results were as follows:

Are you in favor of the budget as adopted on May 14, 2013?

411 Yes 459 No

If the budget is defeated, is the town budget portion too high or too low?

519 Too High 257 Too Low

If the budget is defeated, is the school budget portion too high or too low?

432 Too High 348 Too Low

A total of 868 electors and 7 property owners voted.

A Grand Tour... The John E. Jackman Tour de Mansfield

The cooler weather held out just long enough for the 100+ cyclists participating in the annual *John E. Jackman Tour de Mansfield* to head out on their 40-Mile, 20-Mile, and 5-Mile Family Fun Rides on Saturday, June 22. The day began with a few words from event organizer Jessica Tracy, Recreation Supervisor of Health and Fitness at the Community Center, who welcomed the riders and spoke about the new name of the bike tour, renamed in honor of local favorite and former Fire Marshal John Jackman. John, who recently retired after 27 years in service to the Town, is an avid cyclist and was instrumental in creating the Tour de Mansfield.

On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, the day after the referendum, the Town Council held a special meeting to take final action on the FY 2013/14 Budget. At this meeting, the Town Council voted to set the General Government budget at \$15,203,170, the Board of Education budget at \$20,688,160, the Capital Fund budget at \$2,285,290 and the Capital Nonrecurring Fund budget at \$1,834,300. In adopting the budget, the Council made the following changes to the budget adopted at the Annual Town Meeting: reduced the Board of Education budget by \$100,000; reduced the General Government Operations budget by \$25,000; increased the General Fund transfer to CNR by \$333,000; increased the CNR Fund transfer to the Capital Fund by \$639,440; appropriated \$536,910 in new state revenue for tax relief; and left \$350,000 in new state revenue as un-appropriated to provide a reserve for a mid-year rescission or other unforeseen event.

With these changes to the budget adopted at Town Meeting, the Town Council set the mill rate at 27.95 mills, representing an

increase of .79 mills or 2.89% over the current year.



Storrs Center Construction Update

Drivers are reminded that due to construction of Bolton Road Extension and the completion of Royce Circle, the temporary road connecting Dog Lane and Bolton Road is closed.

No left turn from Dog Lane

If you want to turn from Dog Lane to travel south on Storrs Road (Route 195), you will need to turn onto Royce Circle behind the Storrs Center parking garage and follow the newly constructed Wilbur Cross Way to Charles Smith Way (the old "Post Office Road"). Wilbur Cross Way will be one-way during construction.

You can still turn right from Dog Lane onto Storrs Road going North.

This traffic pattern will remain in effect while construction continues on Bolton Road Extension and Royce Circle. Once complete, the intersection of Bolton Road Extension, Storrs Road, and Bolton Road will serve as the main, lighted intersection for Storrs Center.

The new roads will complete the boundaries of the Town Square and will accommodate all traffic heading north and south on Storrs Road. Work is expected to be finished by the fall. Questions? Ask the [Mansfield Downtown Partnership](#) or call 860.429.2740.

A Town Square For Everyone

The town square in Storrs Center is intended to be the focal point for the downtown. It will be a place of community gatherings, as well as a place of respite. Small concerts, festivals, art shows, and the farmers market are possible programs for the town square. The town square is planned, however, to be flexible enough to allow for someone to sit, read, eat lunch, when events are not underway. It will be .53 acres and a mature 80 foot white oak tree has been preserved to be part of the northwestern corner of the site.

Landscape architecture firm Kent+Frost was hired to develop the design of the square. They have been working with the Downtown Partnership and the Town, as well as several interested stakeholders to provide input into the design. The design is expected to be presented as a town zoning permit application in the next few months.

A public hearing will be held as part of that process.

We hope to have Phase 1 complete in the Fall.

The Fee Waiver ordinance is a way to improve access to certain Town services for all residents regardless of their ability to pay. These services include:

- Parks and Recreation Programs
- Community Center Memberships
- Solid Waste/Recycling Fees
- Senior Center Programs
- Planning & Zoning Fees
- Inland Wetland Fees
- Zoning Board of Appeals Fees.



Residents who meet specific income guidelines get a reduction in the fees paid for the services listed above. Your adjusted gross family or household income, and the size of your family determine eligibility for the waiver. You may qualify for either a 50% or a 90% waiver for any fees not reimbursed by a third party.

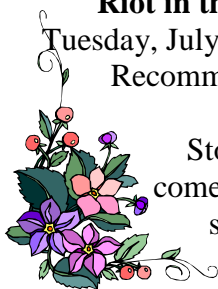
