NEW! Wood Carving and Tool Sharpening

(Ages 12-Adult)

Open to students of all levels of woodworking experience (beginners to advanced), come and learn the basics of several woodcarving methods including chip carving, letter carving, and designing and carving a Tudor Rose as you move through a series of projects! Skills obtained can be applied to sign carving, furniture making, toy making, and wood sculpture. In addition, participants will learn the steps for achieving proper cutting edge on hand tools.
