PREFATORY NOTE.

PUBLICATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE WORK.

BY resolutions of the General Assembly approved March 10, 1886, and April 13, 1887, providing for a record of service of Connecticut men in the late Civil War, it was also provided that the Adjutant-General be authorized to publish "fifteen hundred copies of a catalogue or roll containing the names and records of those soldiers who served in Connecticut organizations and sailors and marines who enlisted in the Navy from this State during the War of the Revolution, the War of 1812 with Great Britain, and the Mexican War."

Under authority of the same resolutions of the Assembly the Adjutant-General was directed to distribute the foregoing copies as follows:—"One copy to each State officer and each officer and member of the present General Assembly; one copy to each town clerk and judge of probate in this State, to be kept in their respective offices and handed over to their successors in office; one copy to the Adjutant-General of the United States, and to the Adjutant-General of each State of the United States; two copies each to the Librarian of the United States, and to the State Library of this State, and one copy to each college and to each circulating library in this State open to the public." It was further provided that one hundred copies of said work "shall be retained in the Adjutant-General's office of this State for such future use or distribution as may be authorized or rendered necessary under the provisions of this resolution, and the balance shall be kept in the office of the Adjutant-General of this State, and furnished to such persons as may desire them, at five dollars per copy, and the proceeds from the sale of said books shall be returned to the State treasury."

INTRODUCTION.

I. REVOLUTIONARY RECORDS OF THE STATE.

IN the compilation of the following Military and Naval record of Connecticut in the War of the Revolution, as called for by Act of the General Assembly approved April 13, 1887, various sources of information have been sought and examined. The original and official manuscripts bearing upon the history of that interesting period are, and long have been, in a more or less dispersed condition—a fact true of the records of all the Thirteen States—and in some instances the greater part has been either lost or destroyed. In the case of Connecticut, while certain gaps occur at intervals in the continuity of her Revolutionary Papers, the more valuable portions have fortunately been preserved and are deposited in permanent and accessible archives. Of this material, the State herself retains a considerable proportion, the Departments of the General Government at Washington contain much, and the remainder has passed by gift and purchase into the keeping of individuals, Societies, and Libraries throughout the country. For convenient reference the documents may be classified as follows:

1. The original minutes of the proceedings of the General Assembly of Connecticut, covering the period of the war, on file in the office of the Secretary of State, Hartford.
2. The original minutes of the proceedings of the Governor and Council, or Committee of War, covering the period of the war, on file in the State Library, Hartford.
3. Pay-Rolls of the Connecticut Regiments in the Continental "Line" for certain years, and scattering pay-table accounts of State troops and militia, together with individual accounts, bound in twelve volumes, on file in the office of the State Comptroller, Hartford.
4. Thirty-eight bound folio volumes, marked "Revolutionary War," covering a period of ten years or more from 1774, and containing numerous original rolls, letters, accounts, resolutions, petitions, town-lists, and similar material, unbound, on file in the State Library.
5. Rolls, letters, and various documents bearing on the service of Connecticut troops, on file among the papers of General Washington in the Department of State, Washington, D. C.
6. Forty-seven bound folio volumes, containing company and regimental muster and pay rolls of the regiments of the Connecticut "Line," together with numerous militia rolls and miscellaneous papers, and the large mass of applications for pensions, on file in the Pension Bureau, Department of the Interior, Washington, D. C.
7. The "Trumbull Papers," consisting of twenty-two bound volumes, containing the official correspondence of Governor Jonathan Trumbull of Connecticut during the entire period of the war, inclusive also of many rolls and miscellaneous documents, in possession of the Massachusetts Historical Society, Boston.

8. Various Revolutionary papers, military and naval, in possession of the Connecticut Historical Society, Hartford.
9. Forty or more Orderly Books, kept by Connecticut officers during the war, containing general, division, brigade, and regimental orders issued in camp and on the march, in the possession for the most part of individuals and Societies.
10. Miscellaneous letters, rolls, maps, diaries, and other papers in the hands of descendants of Revolutionary soldiers, individuals, and collectors, or deposited in Libraries and State and Town archives.

Supplementing these documents, and included among the authorities on which this work is based, must be mentioned the mass of original letters and papers which have found their way into print in such publications as Force's *American Archives*, the volumes issued by Historical Societies, magazines, genealogies, monographs, and Town histories.

II. ARRANGEMENT OF THE ROLLS.

The several rolls and lists in the following pages, compiled from the foregoing records, have been arranged chronologically according to the description of the service in which the troops engaged. Thus, after the first alarm, the Continental soldiers are classified in the order in which they were called out, then the State troops, and finally the Militia, with special lists following.

The Lexington Alarm.—The first lists in the record, grouped under the head of the "Outbreak of the War," include the names of the men who, under the provocation of the moment, marched to the relief of their Massachusetts neighbors in the Lexington Alarm. Some explanation of the nature of this service appears in the introductory text on pages 3 and 4. It will be observed that the forty-eight towns from which the companies set out represent, with three exceptions, the eastern and central counties, which were then the thickly settled sections of the State, the nearest to the point of danger, the best prepared for an emergency, and the most accessible in case of alarm. It may also be noticed that the four thousand townsmen who responded to the Lexington call were a representative body, largely descendants of original settlers, including all elements in the different communities,—judges, pastors, lawyers, physicians, farmers, mechanics, sailors, laborers,—and that as a list of a respectable number of the male inhabitants of the State in 1775, which may be utilized in historical and genealogical researches, a peculiar interest attaches to it. Following in their proper place are the names of the men engaged in the Ticonderoga enterprise.

Continental Troops.—Next in order have been arranged the rolls of the Connecticut quota of that part of the Revolutionary forces known as the "Continental" troops, which constituted the body of Washington's army in the field throughout the war. They stand first in importance, as explained on page 34, and as appears from their military history in the text introductory to the subdivisions A, B, C, and D, under which they have been classified. After the Lexington Alarm the State raised eight regiments, which were adopted as Continental, to serve to the close of the year 1775. She furnished eight for the year 1776, and eight, with a large additional quota, for the three years' term from 1777 to 1781. Thereafter, from 1781 to 1783, the numbers were reduced by consolidations. The rosters of these troops form a large portion of the record (pages 33 to 370), and with the exception of some of the rolls for 1775 and the greater part of those for 1776, are believed to be substantially complete. In view of the importance of the campaign of 1776, it is to be regretted that the rolls of seven of the Continental regiments for that year are missing. The names of very many of the men, however, appear on the rolls of 1775, when they served their first term, or on the rolls of 1777, when they re-enlisted for three years or the war, or again on the rolls of State troops and militia in subsequent years. In the absence of these lists the number of officers and soldiers that entered the Continental service from Connecticut during the war can only be approximately estimated; but it may be placed at about fifteen thousand.

State Troops.—Under this heading appear a certain number of regiments which were neither Continental nor militia, but were raised mainly in the early part of the war, to act as reinforcements for the army in the field, for limited terms. Organized by authority of the State or the Governor, with the officers' commissions signed by the Governor, they were designated as State troops, and at different periods rendered considerable service.

The Militia.—The third distinctive class of troops was the standing Militia of the State, whose rolls, so far as preserved, are arranged, like the preceding, in chronological order. Here again several serious gaps occur in the list, which is a special misfortune from a historical point of view, inasmuch as the militia represented the greater part of the male population of the State. The rolls here published, however, represent a fair proportion of the regiments and men that were called into active service. From the return, as given on page 447, for the year 1782, it may be inferred that the number of effective militia varied during the years of the war from twenty-two to twenty-five thousand.

Miscellaneous Rolls.—The closing pages of the work contain such portions of the Naval record of Connecticut as have been preserved among the documents, also unclassified lists of minutemen, volunteers, independent companies, and individual officers and soldiers, and copies of the Pension lists as published in Congressional and Government documents at various periods since the war.

In compiling and arranging the rolls, as grouped above, a limited amount of explanatory text has been inserted, showing where and for what terms the troops served. It has been possible to do this with a satisfactory degree of accuracy in the case of the regiments of the Continental "Line," and on pages 125-140 and 301-311 may be found an outline of their organization and service generally—battles, encampments, itinerary, and formations—which has been prepared from original letters and Order-books. An introductory note also appears before each regimental roster. In the case of many of the militia regiments and detachments, no record of service has been found.

The publication of this work will doubtless lead to the production or discovery of missing documents, including rolls of entire regiments, companies, or the record of individuals, which it may be desirable to issue in supplementary form in the future. It is especially requested that the originals or copies of these may be forwarded to the Adjutant-General of Connecticut at Hartford.

III. RELATION OF THE STATE TO THE WAR.

The number of separate names in the following lists, as arranged in the Index, reaches a total of twenty-seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-three. In a few cases, probably, through different spelling of names, the same individual has been entered more than once. On the other hand, it is to be observed that in numerous cases the same name represents different individuals. Thus, in the Lexington Alarm list, the William Lyon, of New Haven, could not have been the William Lyon of Woodstock, nor Lieut. William Adams, of the Fourth "Connecticut Line" for 1777-81, be either of the privates of the same name in his regiment. In the Index, however, these five individuals count only as two—William Lyon and William Adams. The identity of others, owing to the absence of a "residence" column in many of the rolls, cannot always be distinguished. From these circumstances it is evidently impossible to give the exact number of different individuals of whom some record has been entered. A total of thirty thousand may be accepted as a reasonable estimate. Of this number some ten thousand represent Continental soldiers—men who had enlisted for long terms and served in the field outside of the State under Washington's immediate command. A complete record, as already indicated, would embrace several thousand additional names, especially of the militia. From expressions used by Governor Trumbull in his correspondence, the wording of the calls for temporary service, and the make-up of town militia lists, it is apparent that, barring a small loyalist element in the western part of the State, nearly every able-bodied man in Connecticut rendered, or

was enrolled as notified and prepared to render, some kind of service during the Revolutionary War. The exposed situation of the State, with her entire coast subject to incursions and ravages by the enemy and her proximity to the several fields of operations in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and New York, required her to remain in a constant state of preparation. On this account, and because of the size of her population, then relatively large, she was regarded as one of the four strong States supporting the cause, ranking in capacity next after Massachusetts, Virginia, and Pennsylvania. How far the State was represented with her neighbors in the fortunes of the war, sharing with them both success and defeat, is a matter of general history, confirmed by the record in the following pages, from which it appears that after the Lexington Alarm, Connecticut troops participated in all the principal battles, with the exception of those fought in the extreme Southern field. They were present and engaged at the

A.—THE LEXINGTON ALARM.

THE Revolutionary record of Connecticut opens with her response to the historic Lexington alarm of April 19, 1775, and closes eight years and a half later with the disbandment, after the Peace, of her last regiment in the field, in November, 1783.

The attitude assumed by the colonists at the beginning of the struggle was that of vigilance and self-defense. Alarmed by the determination of the home government, openly declared within recent years, to establish its authority more firmly in America, they entered vigorous protests against the new policy as tending to endanger certain privileges of their own, assured to them by charter or long enjoyment. While differing somewhat from each other, either in creed, temperament, descent, or manners, the people in the several colonies, or the great majority of them, stood politically, in 1775, on the common platform of non-interference in their local affairs. They advocated home-rule combined with loyalty to the general interests of the British Empire, which, in effect, represents the relations existing between England and her larger dependencies at the present day. In this sense the cause of any one of the American colonies was the cause of all. An attempt upon the privileges of one was a threat against all. An alarm sounded in one locality was bound to spread by common sympathy to every other.

In Connecticut, especially in her eastern section, this colonial spirit took deep root, and when Massachusetts, in 1774, was made the subject of restrictive measures by the home ministry, general indignation was aroused. As the possibility of a collision became apparent town meetings were held, contributions of money and provisions were voted for the distressed inhabitants of Boston, whose port had been closed by act of Parliament, non-intercourse with British merchants advised, a general congress representing all the colonies proposed, and Committees of Correspondence appointed to circulate all news of importance. A convention of delegates from the two counties of New London and Windham, held at Norwich, September 8, 1774, went further and recommended their towns to keep up their stock of ammunition and attend to the exercise of the train-bands. In the Assembly of the Colony, which in May, 1774, adopted resolutions protesting against the recent acts of Parliament touching America, the drift of events was so far recognized, that, in October, it required the selectmen of the towns to provide a double quantity of "powder, balls, and flint," and in January, 1775, ordered the entire militia to muster and drill once a week during the three months following. The situation was characterized as "an alarming crisis."

The crisis culminated on April 19, 1775. A detachment of British troops marching out from Boston to seize military stores alleged to have been collected at Concord for hostile purposes, was met upon the road by the Provincials and a bloody encounter took place. The since famous skirmishes of Lexington and Concord were fought, which precipitated the Revolutionary War. An "alarm" was immediately spread in every direction, so that on the 27th of April it had reached the principal points as far as Baltimore, and by the 11th of May was posted at Charleston, S. C. Throughout New England the news was rapidly carried by horse "expresses" from town to town. It was dispatched to Connecticut by the Massachusetts Committee of Safety at Watertown during the progress of the fighting, or "near ten o'clock" of Wednesday morning, April 19th: "The bearer, Israel Bessel, is charged to alarm the country quite to Connecticut, and all persons are desired to furnish him with fresh horses as they may be needed." During Thursday, the 20th, the news was circulating through the eastern part of the Colony. The people of Windham County received it

generally by noon. It reached Governor Trumbull at Lebanon not long after. It was doubtless at Hartford before night; at New Haven on the following evening, Friday, the 21st, and forwarded from there through Fairfield and Stamford to New York.

Prepared to a certain extent for such an alarm, a large number of able-bodied men in Connecticut hurried off to Massachusetts. The wording used in the records of the day, "marched for the relief of Boston," expresses alike the extent of their sympathies and the nature of the service intended. The response to the alarm was not the official action of the Colony, nor, on the other hand, an impromptu movement of individuals without previous organization. An "uprising" of armed men might have partaken of a mob character, and the militia regiments as such could only be called out by the governor or legislature. It was rather a movement of the townsmen marching under their militia organizations. The gathering thus became orderly as well as spontaneous, and represented the town spirit shown previously in protests and resolutions. It appears from the records that in some cases the companies or train-bands collected and marched off under their officers without further orders; in other cases, the colonels taking the lead, called out a certain number of their men and directed them to march forthwith to the point of danger; in a few cases volunteer companies were organized for the special service; in addition, many individuals, not belonging to the militia, joined in the march, either providing for themselves or going with the companies. Colonel Williams of the 11th Regiment, sends out word on the 20th, "that it will be expedient for every man to go who is fit and willing." A letter dated Wethersfield, April 23d, describes the scene there as follows: "We are all in motion here, and equipt from the Town yesterday, one hundred young men, who cheerfully offered their service, twenty-days' provision and sixty-four rounds per man. They are all well armed and in high spirits. My brother has gone with them and others of the first property. Our neighboring towns are all arming and moving. Men of the first character shoulder their arms and march off for the field of action. We shall by night have several thousands from this Colony on their march. . . . We fix on our Standards and Drums the Colony arms, with the motto 'qui transtulit sustinet,' round it in letters of gold, which we construe thus: 'God, who transplanted us hither, will support us.'" Writing from Wallingford, April 24th, Mr. James Lockwood says: "Col. Wadsworth was over at this place most of yesterday and has ordered twenty men out of each Company of his Regiment, some of which had already set off and others go this morning. . . . The Country beyond here are all gone." Nor were the Colony officials inactive. Upon receiving "the tragical narrative" from Massachusetts, Gov. Trumbull issued writs for a special meeting of the Assembly on the 26th, and the general Committee of Correspondence sent prompt assurance of assistance to President Hancock of the Massachusetts Provincial Congress. Writing from Lebanon on the 21st, the Committee say: "Every preparation is making to support your Province. . . . The ardour of our people is such that they can't be kept back. The Colonels are to forward part of the best men and the most ready, as fast as possible, the remainder to be ready at a moment's warning. These are the present movements with us."

The number of men who are reported in the records to have marched in the Lexington alarm was about four thousand. The duty was necessarily temporary and brief. Some of the companies returned home before reaching Boston, as their presence was not needed. Upon the organization of regiments for service during the year, many of the same men enlisted and continued for different terms during the war. At the May session of the Legislature their service was recognized and the men paid for the time as given on the following lists, the originals of which are on file in the State Library, *Rev. War, Vol. II.*

B.—THE TICONDEROGA ENTERPRISE.

THE possession and control of Lakes George and Champlain had, from an early date, been regarded by the people of New York and New England as necessary to their protection against the encroachments of the French in Canada. It was around Ticonderoga and Crown Point that the greater part of the fighting in the French and Indian War occurred. When the Revolutionary struggle opened, the importance of those posts was at once recognized in the northern colonies, and far-sighted individuals in Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New York, alike proposed their immediate seizure. In addition Fort Ticonderoga contained cannon and stores just then much needed by the Provincials. The step seemed urgent inasmuch as England's hold on the Canadas was firmer than elsewhere in America, and the people of those provinces were not prepared to disturb it. In the approaching contest, accordingly, the line of the St. Lawrence and the lake region would again become the field of military operations.

In Connecticut and Massachusetts movements were set on foot to secure the old fortress at Ticonderoga immediately after the Lexington alarm. It was then garrisoned by Captain Delaplace of the Twenty-sixth Regiment, British army, and a small company of regulars. In Connecticut the enterprise originated, as reported by Capt. Edward Mott, one of the leaders engaged, in the following manner: "A number of the principal gentlemen of the Assembly at Hartford, on Friday, the twenty-eighth day of April, Conversing on the distressed Condition of the people of Boston, and the means necessary to relieve them, fell on the Scheme to take that Fortress [Ticonderoga], that we might have the advantage of the Cannon that were there, to relieve the people of Boston. I told the Gentlemen that in my opinion it might be taken by surprise with a few men, if properly Conducted. On which they desired me, if I was willing to serve my country in that way, to join Captain Noah Phelps, of Simsbury, and Mr. Bernard Romans, on that design, and furnished us with three hundred Pounds in Cash from the Treasury, and desired us to go forward to the Upper Towns, and search into the situation of said Garrison, and, if I thought proper to proceed to take possession of the same." The gentlemen referred to by Mott, who on their individual notes procured the money from the Treasury, were Samuel Wyllys, Jesse Root, and Ezekiel Williams of Hartford, Samuel Bishop, Jr., and Adam Babcock, of New Haven, Samuel Holden Parsons, of New London, Silas Deane, of Wethersfield, William Williams, of Lebanon, Charles Webb, of Stamford, Joshua Porter, of Salisbury, and Thomas Mumford, of Groton. With this informal authority Captains Mott and Phelps, with six or eight volunteers from Hartford, proceeded to Salisbury where the entire party was increased to sixteen. From that point they continued to Pittsfield, Mass., where Col. James Easton, John Brown, Israel Dickinson, and about fifty men were enlisted in the enterprise. In the Hampshire Grants Col. Ethan Allen and Seth Warner, both natives of Connecticut, and one hundred Green Mountain Boys were added to the party, and early on May 10th the fortress was surprised and taken without loss. Capt. Phelps states in a memorial that when the expedition reached Bennington, a council of war was held which directed him and Mr. Hecock, from Sheffield, to proceed in disguise to the fort beforehand and report on its condition, which service he "cheerfully undertook."

Of the Connecticut party, Capt. Mott, as chairman, Epaphras Bull, Noah Phelps, and Col. Easton, of Pittsfield, constituted a "Committee of War for the expedition against Ticonderoga and Crown Point," and by its authority the command of the expedition at the time of the surprise was

given to Col. Ethan Allen. That officer, in reporting his success to the Massachusetts authorities, stated that the attempt was made "by the order of the General Assembly of the Colony of Connecticut."

In Massachusetts an independent movement was undertaken. The Provincial Committee of Safety, which had previously inquired into the condition of affairs in Canada, appreciated the importance of Ticonderoga, and it appears were urged to secure it by Benedict Arnold, who had then lately arrived with his New Haven Company in the Lexington Alarm. The Committee entrusted the undertaking to Arnold, and on May 3d appointed him "Colonel and Commander-in-Chief" of a body of men not exceeding four hundred which he was to enlist in Western Massachusetts and vicinity, and with them effect the capture of the fortress. Arnold started off alone and overtook the Connecticut expedition under Ethan Allen. By virtue of his Massachusetts commission he demanded the sole command of the party, but upon its refusal to accept his leadership, he marched with it to the fort and entered the gate "side by side" with Col. Allen. Col. Arnold then enlisted a portion of the regiment authorized by the committee and occupied points on the lakes, at times being in command at Crown Point, which had also been seized, and again at Ticonderoga. On May 18th with fifty men under Captains Brown and Oswald he surprised St. John — Oswald being one of the members of Arnold's New Haven Company.

Following up this successful stroke, Governor Trumbull ordered one of the newly raised regiments for the year '75, under Col. Hinman, to march immediately to Ticonderoga and Crown Point and occupy them. A request to this effect was also made by the Continental Congress. The Massachusetts Provincial Congress had informed Col. Arnold that as "the affairs of that expedition began in the Colony of Connecticut," they had written to its Assembly to assume full charge of it. Upon the arrival of Col. Hinman, however, Arnold declined to serve under him and disbanding his small regiment, resigned his Massachusetts' colonelcy June 24th, to appear next, in September, in command of the expedition through the Maine woods to Quebec.

Upon the assumption in July of the command of Northern New York, or the Northern Department as it was commonly known, by Major-Gen. Philip Schuyler, Fort Ticonderoga passed under the direction of the Continental authorities. It was held by the Americans throughout the war, except during the interval of the Burgoyne alarm and campaign from July to November, 1777.

The following lists are arranged from the original MSS. in the State Library, *Rev. War, Vol. III*. The first list represents, as far as the records indicate, the party of sixteen which Capt. Mott states to have started from Connecticut in the first instance to become the nucleus of the expedition.

THE CONTINENTAL ARMY.

THE following rosters of troops, arranged chronologically under the headings A, B, C, and D, include the quotas contributed by Connecticut to what was known as the Continental Army of the Revolution.

The term "Continental Army" first appears upon the printed records of the Continental Congress in the summary of the proceedings for June 14, 1775, where the form of enlistment to be subscribed by companies of riflemen is given. It was to be an enlistment into "the American Continental Army." On the same day a Committee of five was appointed to prepare rules and regulations for the government of this prospective army, which were reported and adopted on the 30th. On June 15th, it was resolved "That a General be appointed to command all the Continental forces, raised or to be raised, for the defence of American Liberty," and Washington was unanimously elected.

At the opening of the War, or for the year 1775, no Continental force was in the first instance organized as such by Congress. As the New England Colonies were mustering their own troops around Boston and Ticonderoga after the Lexington alarm, Congress adopted them as Continental. Troops joining them from New York and elsewhere were generally recruited on the Continental basis. For the succeeding years of the war, Congress took the initiative and raised troops for the common army under its own regulations respecting pay, subsistence, and term of service. The force, as will appear, was organized and re-organized several times and for various terms.

These Continentals were the "regulars" of the Revolution. They formed the main army in the field and were the chief dependence of the Colonial cause. In arranging rosters of that war, accordingly, the Continental army occupies the central and most prominent place. All other troops raised during the war, whether State or militia, were to act as reinforcements of this army or to relieve it by serving in alarms at different points. They are so classified after the Continentals. See "Arrangement of the Rolls" in the Introduction.

A.—REGIMENTS FOR 1775.

ORGANIZATION.—The voluntary mustering in the Alarm of April 19th was followed immediately by the first authorized call for troops. On the 20th, upon the receipt of the Lexington news, Gov. Trumbull summoned the General Assembly to a special session at Hartford to convene the following Wednesday, April 26th. Publishing the call on his own views of the emergency he also received urgent appeals from the Massachusetts authorities for aid and support. Under date of April 20th the Committee of Safety at Cambridge wrote to him as follows: "As the troops have now commenced hostilities, we think it our duty to exert our utmost strength to save our country from absolute slavery. We pray your Honours would afford us all the assistance in your power, and shall be glad that our brethren who come to our aid may be supplied with military stores and provisions, as we have none of either more than is absolutely necessary for ourselves." Again on April 26th they wrote: "The distressed situation in which we are, and the danger to which the liberties of all America, and especially the New England Colonies are exposed, will be the best apology for the importunate application to you for immediate assistance. We pray as you regard the safety of your country, that as large a number of troops as you can spare may immediately march forward."

The Assembly met on the date indicated and held a ten days' session, adjourning Saturday noon, May 6th. While preparing for resistance it refrained from aggressive declarations. It recognized the skirmishes at Lexington and Concord as "Sundry acts of hostility and violence committed in the Province of Massachusetts Bay, by which many lives have been lost," and through a committee of two of its members, as bearers of a letter from the Governor, requested General Gage at Boston to explain his military preparations and late incursion. Its attitude is represented in these expressions in the Governor's letter: "The people of this Colony, you may rely upon it, abhor the idea of taking up arms against the troops of their sovereign, and dread nothing so much as the horrors of a civil war. But, Sir, at the same time we beg leave to assure your Excellency, that as they apprehend themselves justified by the principle of self-defence, they are most firmly resolved to defend their rights and privileges to the last extremity; nor will they be restrained from giving aid to their brethren if any unjustifiable attack is made upon them."

The leading measure of the session was *An Act for assembling, equipping, etc., a Number of the Inhabitants of this Colony for the Special Defence and Safety thereof*. It provided that one fourth part of the Colony militia should be forthwith enlisted, accoutred, and assembled, to be led and conducted as the General Assembly should order. This apportionment represented about six thousand men, who were to be distributed in six regiments of ten companies each, with a full complement of field, staff, and line officers. The entire body was to be commanded by one major-general and two brigadier-generals, each of whom was also to take command of a regiment as colonel. Arms, equipments, pay, billeting, and bounty money were provided, and "beating orders" delivered to the officers to recruit their companies by voluntary enlistment. The term of service was not to exceed seven months.

At the third special session of the Assembly, convened July 1, 1775, two more regiments, somewhat smaller, were ordered, making eight in all, consisting of about seven thousand four hundred men. This included the entire number of troops called out by authority of the Colony, for service which took them beyond its limits, in the year 1775. The officers were all appointed by the Assembly.

As Continental Troops.—Accepting war as inevitable the Continental Congress at Philadelphia proceeded, as stated on page 34, to organize a Continental Army. The troops which had hurriedly gathered

around Boston, including regiments from Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and two of the Connecticut regiments referred to above, were already in the field as good material for the nucleus of such an army. Washington arrived in camp at Cambridge on July 3d, and the Colony troops having accepted his leadership and the regulations of Congress, the entire force was placed upon a Continental establishment. This new relation was officially announced by Washington in General Orders dated "Head Quarters, Cambridge, July 4, 1775," as follows:

"The Continental Congress having now taken all the Troops of the several Colonies, which have been raised, or which may be hereafter raised, for the support and defence of the Liberties of America into their Pay and Service; They are now the Troops of the United Provinces of North America; and it is to be hoped that all Distinctions of Colonies will be laid aside; so that one and the same spirit may animate the whole, and the only Contest be, who shall render on this great and trying occasion, the most essential Service to the great and common cause in which we are all engaged.

Service.—Of the eight Connecticut regiments organized as stated, five were ordered at different times during the summer to the Boston camps under Washington and three to the Northern Department under Schuyler. The five were those of Generals Spencer and Putnam and Colonels Parsons, Charles Webb, and Huntington. With them also were four companies of the regiments under Schuyler, indicated in the rolls. These troops were engaged with the army in general in throwing up works around Boston and maintaining the siege of the place. Some dissatisfaction occurred among the men and many returned home just before the expiration of their term of service. Their excuses were those of men who had enlisted provisionally and as yet had not learned the true meaning of military discipline. Desertion they disclaimed. The trouble proved to be temporary, as the regiments, upon the enlistment of troops for the next year, were recruited to the average strength.

The three regiments for the Northern Department were those of General Wooster and Colonels Hinman and Waterbury, with one company of Colonel Parsons' regiment. They took part in the operations under Schuyler and Montgomery, looking to the secure possession of Lakes George and Champlain and the invasion of Canada. Much sickness prevailed among the men. The records show that these regiments at first declined to be mustered as Continental, the men preferring to remain during their term, which expired December 10, on the Colony establishment; but the matter coming before the Legislature at its October session, it resolved that all the Connecticut troops "then employed against the ministerial troops in Canada, shall be subject to the rules, orders, regulations, and discipline of the Congress of the twelve United Colonies during the time of their enlistment." They thus became what they had been considered in the field — Continental regiments.

Bunker Hill and Quebec.—In a note appended to General Putnam's, or the Third Regiment, some statements appear respecting the Connecticut detachment at Bunker Hill, and at the close of the record for 1775 (following Huntington's regiment) the record of Connecticut men in the Quebec Expedition is given.

The list of Staff officers and rosters of the regiments for 1775, compiled from the records, State Library, *Rev. War, Vols. II and III*, and other original sources, are as follows:

In French and Indian War, appt. by Conn. Assembly, Colonel of one of the Colony regts. for campaigns of 1756, '58, '59, and '60. Age in 1775, sixty-four.

During siege of Boston, commanded a brigade of four regts., including his own, with Parsons' and Huntington's, in Gen. Ward's division at Roxbury. Record cont. in '76. — *Previous service*: Major and Lieut.-Col. in French and Indian war. At outbreak of the Revolution he was Colonel of the 12th Regt. Colony militia.

Senior officer present and in command at Battle of Bunker Hill, June 17. Appt. by Congress, June 19, Major-General on Continental establishment, superseding Wooster and Spencer. During siege of Boston, commanded center division of two brigades, Hd. Qrs at Cambridge. Record cont. in '76. — *Previous service*: Captain and Major, French and Indian War; Lt.-Col. in expedition against Havana, 1762; Lieut.-Col of 11th Regiment Militia, at outbreak of Revolutionary War.

About Sept. 28, the regiment, under orders from Congress, marched to the Northern Department, Gen. Schuyler's, and took part in operations along Lakes George and Champlain. Assisted in the reduction of St. John's in Oct., and afterwards was stationed in part at Montreal. Adopted as Continental. Much sickness prevailed in the command and many soldiers were furloughed or mustered out in Oct.-Nov. Wooster organized a provisional regiment for service from Dec., '75, to the spring of '76, and about one hundred and fifty men enlisted from various regiments. See p. 44.]

Jonathan Heart, of Southington, (afterwards an officer through the war,) is said to have been in one of the regiments before Boston in '75. He may have been a volunteer in the 2^d Co. of Spencer's Regt. as Capt. Scott of that Co. authorizes the Pay table Committee to deliver the pay for his men "to Jonathan Heart."

A number of men entered as deserters about Dec. 1, afterwards explained, in petitions, that they had no intention of deserting, but believed that their term had expired on that date instead of the 10th. The Assembly ordered them to be paid for full time. Some of these cases are on record, viz.: Serjt. Joseph Stocking, Privates Thos. Jeroms, Thos. Gilbert, Amos Rose, and Thos. Gould (not on the Co. rolls above), of the 6th Co.; Amos Fuller, of the 8th Co.; and William Crane, of Wethersfield, of the 9th Co. Respecting the latter, his mother, Lydia Crane, states in a petition that she had three sons in the service in 1775. The eldest (name not given) died in camp; the second (probably Joseph Crane, 9th Co.) returned; and the third, the above William Crane, who had enlisted in Chester's Co. and fought at Bunker Hill, left his regiment about Nov. 30, supposing his time out, but being taking down with fever on the way, wandered in his delirium to Leicester, Mass., and died there.

THIRD REGIMENT—GEN. PUTNAM'S—1775.

[Regiment raised on the first call for troops by the Legislature at special session of April-May, 1775. It was recruited in Windham County, with one Company from New London County, as indicated by the residences of the officers. Marching in May by companies to the camps forming around Boston, it was stationed during the siege in Putnam's Center Division at Cambridge until expiration of term of service, Dec. 10, 1775. In July it was adopted as Continental. A detachment of the officers and men was engaged at Bunker Hill, as stated in the note on the battle appended to the last Company; a few men also joined the Quebec expedition. In re-enlisting troops for service in 1776, this regiment was re-organized with Benedict Arnold, then before Quebec, as Colonel.]

NOTE ON BUNKER HILL.

THE number of Connecticut troops present at this engagement was about four hundred. As far as letters and meagre records show they were detailed as follows: On the evening of June 16, '75, a body of one thousand men from the Massachusetts and Connecticut regiments around Cambridge, under the immediate command of Col. Prescott, was ordered to Charlestown Neck to fortify Bunker's (Breed's) Hill. Of this number two hundred were from Conn. under the command of Capt. Knowlton, the detachment being made up of details of one subaltern officer and about thirty men from companies in Putnam's and Spencer's regiments. Lt.-Col. Storrs, of Putnam's, states that he sent from his company, "Lieut. Dana, Serjt. Fuller, Corp. Webb, and 28 Privates." Capt. Chester, of Spencer's, states that thirty-one went from his company, probably under Lieut. Stephen Goodrich. Putnam's own company was represented by Lieut. Grosvenor and thirty men.

Prescott's command, working all night, completed a redoubt which threatened the British shipping. Lord Howe determined to drive the "rebels" from it, and the battle of Bunker Hill followed, June 17. During the progress of the action, Captain Knowlton and the Connecticut men, with others, were sent to the left where they posted themselves behind a stone wall and inflicted heavy loss upon the enemy. Reinforcements from the American camp arrived both before and during the battle. Among these were the whole or portions of at least three companies of Connecticut troops. Captain Chester reached the stone wall with the rest of his company, perhaps sixty men, and Captains Clark and Coit, of Parsons' regiment, also arrived. These with the two hundred detailed the evening before would make about four hundred as Connecticut's representation at the battle.

Among the Connecticut officers mentioned as present in the action were Gen. Putnam, in general command, Major Durkee, Captains Chester, Clark, Coit, Lieuts. Dana, Keyes, Hide, Webb, Grosvenor, Bingham (of Norwich), and Ensigns Hill and Bill (of Lebanon). A few of the men's names are also reported, namely: Roger Fox, William Cheeney, Asahel Lyon, Benjamin Rist, Samuel Ashbo, Gershom Smith, Matthew Cummings, Daniel Memory — killed; Philip Johnston, Wilson Rowlandson, Lawrence Sullivan, William Robinson, Benjamin Ross — prisoners; Gershom Clark, of Lebanon, wounded; James Law, of Lebanon — right arm broken; John Arnold, Ebenezer Clark, Elijah Abbe, William Clark, Beriah Geer, Nathan Richardson, William Watrous, Sylvanus Snow, William Moore, John Wampee, and Timothy Bugbee — lost their guns in the fight. As to losses, one account gives fourteen killed and thirty wounded among the Connecticut men. Dr. Philip Turner is mentioned as "attend^d wounded after Charlestown Battle." Lawrence Sullivan, prisoner, was released Feb. 24, '76. William Crane, of Wethersfield, Chester's Co., was in the action.

Lieut.-Col. Storrs makes the following entry in his diary (*MSS.*) June 17, the day of the battle:

"At sunrise this morning a fire began from y^e ships, but moderate. About 10 went down to y^e Hill to Genl. Putnam's Post, who has y^e command. Some shot whistled around us. Tarried there a spell and Returned to have my company in readiness to relieve them — One killed & 1 wounded when I came away. About 2 o'clock there was a brisk cannonade from y^e ships on y^e Battery or Entrenchment. At — orders came to turn out immediately, and that the Regulars were landing at sundry places. Went to Head Quarters for our Regimental —. Received orders to repair with our Regiment to No. 1, and defend it. No enemy appearing — orders soon came that our People in the Intrenchment were retreating and for us to secure y^e retreat. Immediately marched for their relief. The Regulars did not come off from Bunker's Hill but have taken possession of the Intrenchments and our People make a Stand on Winter Hill and we immediately went to entrenching. Flung up by morning an entrenchment about 100 feet square. Done principally by our Regiment under Putnam's directions. Had but little sleep the night."

SIXTH REGIMENT—COL. PARSONS'—1775.

[Raised on the first call for troops in April—May, 1775. Recruited from New London, Hartford, and present Middlesex Counties. Two Companies, including Capt. Coit's, marched at once to Boston, and Capt. Mott's was ordered to the Northern Dept. The other Companies remained on duty at New London until June 17, when they were ordered by the Governor's Council to the Boston Camps. There the regiment took post at Roxbury in Gen. THE QUEBEC EXPEDITION, 1775.

OFFICERS AND SOLDIERS DETACHED FROM THE CONNECTICUT TROOPS.

[Upon the capture of Fort Ticonderoga in May, '75, the project of invading Canada became popular both in Congress and the Army. Gen. Montgomery having been authorized to make the attempt by way of Lake Champlain, Washington organized an expedition to co-operate with him by way of the Kennebec and the Maine woods. This force was composed of thirteen companies of volunteers detached from the several New England regiments around Boston and the Penn. and Va. rifle companies lately arrived in camp—the total number of officers and men being 1300. Connecticut's quota was one full Company, 100 strong. Col. Benedict Arnold was assigned to the command of the force with Lieut. Cols. Green, of R. I., and Enos, of Conn., and Maj's Bigelow of Mass. and Meigs of Conn., as the other field officers. The Connecticut Co. was commanded by Capt. Hanchett. Montgomery and Arnold joined forces before Quebec and attempted its capture by assault, Dec. 31, '75, with the well known disastrous result.]

Jonathan Bill, of Lebanon, states that at the assault he "just ascaped with the loss of his cloathing and arms while he was helping to carry off the sick and wounded."¹

¹ The above eighty-nine men, with the eight officers and two "volunteers," represent very nearly the full complement called for from the Connecticut regiments for the expedition.

NOTES ON THE SERVICE, 1775.

ARMS AND ACCOUTREMENTS.—At the special April session of the Legislature, when the first regiments were called out, it was enacted that the enlisted men should be furnished with good fire-arms, belonging to the colony, if they were unable to furnish themselves; and if they found their own arms, to be paid 10s. for the use of such arms. And in case more arms should be required they were to be impressed from householders not enrolled; ten shillings were to be awarded to all who offered guns, bayonets, and cartouch boxes to the soldiers. It was resolved at the same time that three thousand stand of arms be procured for the colony, "of the following dimensions, to wit: the length of the barrel three feet ten inches, the diameter of the bore from inside to inside three-quarters of an inch, the length of the blade of the bayonet fourteen inches, the length of the socket four inches and one-quarter; that the barrels be of suitable thickness, with iron ramrods and a spring in the lowest loop to secure the ramrods, a good substantial lock, and a good stock well mounted with brass and marked with the name or initial letters of the maker's name." *Col. Records, Vol. XIV, p. 420.* Officers wore swords, or "hangers" as then commonly called.

Soldiers' Rations.—At the May session, the ration for the troops was fixed as follows: Three-fourths of a pound of pork or one pound of beef, one pound of bread or flour, three pints of beer to each man per day—beef to be fresh two days in a week; also, a half-pint of rice or a pint of Indian meal; six ounces of butter, and three pints of peas or beans each man per week. Soldiers on fatigue duty were to be allowed one gill of rum each per day, and at no other time. Milk, candles, soap, molasses, vinegar, coffee, chocolate, sugar, tobacco, and vegetables in season, were to be provided subject to the order of general and field officers. After the troops became Continental, the ration, as authorized by Congress, was not as liberal, either in quantity or variety, as the colony allowance.

Uniforms and Camp Equipage.—The troops for 1775 were generally without uniforms. They marched in citizens' clothes, with blankets and knapsacks. A few exceptions are noted, such as Captain Chester's Wethersfield Company, of the Second Regiment, which was clothed "wholly in blue turned up with red," and Captain Arnold's company of Governor's Guards, New Haven, in the Lexington alarm. Individual officers provided themselves with uniforms, but their rank was distinguished by different colored ribbons, which they were directed to wear.

Camp equipage consisted of tents or "marques" for officers, tents for soldiers, and tin and brass kettles, iron pots, frying pans, wooden bowls, and quart cups for company cooking and "messes." Each company was allowed one cart or wagon.

Regimental Standards.—It was enacted by the Legislature that the eight regiments of '75 should be distinguished by flags of different colors, as follows: 1st Regt., yellow; 2d Regt., blue; 3d Regt., scarlet; 4th Regt., crimson; 5th Regt., white; 6th Regt., azure; 7th Regt., blue (?); 8th Regt., orange.

PRISONERS.

Beyond the men of Captain Hanchett's company, captured at the assault on Quebec, few Connecticut soldiers were taken prisoners in '75. Six or seven were captured at Bunker Hill, as noted. The following surrendered with Col. Ethan Allen near Montreal, Sept. 25, and were confined in jail at Halifax:

Roger Moore, Salisbury; Levi Barnum and Ebenezer Mack, Norfolk; John Gray, Samuel Lewis, Adonijah Muxum, David Goss [Goff?], Sharon; Ithuriel Flowers, Hartford; Charles Stewart, Stamford; Jonathan Mahn, Goshen; William Drinkwater, New Milford; Zachariah Brinsmade, Woodbury; John James Burke, Preston Denton, Barnabas Cone; Peter Noble (made his escape at Cape Fear, North Carolina).—Levi Munson, of Wallingford, taken with the same party, was sent to England with others, but returned to Halifax, June 21, '76; exchanged later and re-ent. Cont. service in '77.—Amos Green, of Branford, was captured in Northern Dept. Oct. 20, '75, carried to Quebec and then to England, where he remained till Aug., '76. Returning to Halifax he escaped, and in the course of two months reached his home.

Asa Whitney, of Salisbury, was armorer in Northern Dept. 2 months and 20 days from about July 20, '75.

Lieut. Charles Smith, of Hebron, belonging to Capt. Hart's Co. in Col. Sergeant's Mass. Regt. "absconded" in Aug. '75.

Capt. Noah Phelps, of Simsbury, who figured in the Ticonderoga Enterprise, appears later as army "contractor" in Northern Dept.

Lieut. Luther Stoddard, of Canaan, in 4th Company of Hinman's Regt., was also Adjutant of the Regt.

Mark Mezuzan, of Branford, is paid as Quarter Master in Northern Dept. He may have filled that position in Wooster's Regt.; doubtless the same officer Qr. Mr. in Col. Moses Hazen's Cont. Regt. in '77.

B.—REGIMENTS FOR 1776.

ORGANIZATION.—The regiments called out in 1775, although adopted as Continental, constituted a provisional force. Raised by their respective colonies to meet an emergency their service was limited to short terms. Nearly all were to disband in December, when it was expected, as had usually been the case in the French and Indian war, that military operations would cease for the winter. As it was imperative, however, to continue to hem in the enemy at Boston and hold the ground gained in the Northern Department, as well as prepare generally for a determined struggle, Congress at an early date moved to organize a new force for 1776. On Sept. 26, 1775, President Hancock writing to Washington invited his attention to the following points: "The continuation of the army now under your command in the service of the Continent, after the terms of its enlistment shall have been completed; the reducing of the several corps of Provincials, which at present compose your army, into one body of Continental Forces; what number will be necessary for the winter campaign; what rations shall be allowed the men, and what further regulations may be necessary for the government of those Forces. Upon these heads the Congress wish to be favored with the result of your deliberations as soon as possible." On receipt of these instructions the Commander-in-Chief called a council of the General officers, Oct. 8th, to consider plans for "the continuance and new-modelling" of the army, when it was advised that a new force of about twenty thousand men be raised to maintain the position before Boston, and that it be enlisted for one year from Jan. 1, 1776. Congress furthermore appointed a Committee of three—Dr. Franklin, Mr. Lynch, and Col. Harrison—to repair to Headquarters at Cambridge, and consult in the matter in person with Washington and delegates from the New England Colonies. This Conference met on Oct. 18th—the Connecticut delegates being Deputy-Governor Griswold and Mr. Nathaniel Wales—and after deliberating four days accepted the conclusions of the General officers. It was agreed that, exclusive of riflemen and artillery, twenty-six regiments consisting each of seven hundred and twenty-eight men and officers, divided into eight companies, should be raised under Continental directions, to serve until Jan. 1, 1777. Connecticut's quota remained the same as before—five regiments. Her delegates expressed the opinion at the Conference that "eight thousand men may be raised in their Province to serve the next Campaign on the same terms as the present, viz.: forty shillings bounty."

On Nov. 4th, Congress adopted the report of the Conference, and Washington took steps to organize the new force. He called upon and urged the soldiers already in the field for '75 to re-enlist for another year, and new lists of field and line officers were made out under whom they were to serve. The Connecticut regiments of '75 were "remodelled" on this plan. Gen. Putnam's was given to Benedict Arnold, Gen. Spencer's continued under Col. Wyllys, and Cols. Parsons, C. Webb, and Huntington remained in command of their own as before. In the arrangement of the twenty-six regiments for '76 (afterwards increased to twenty-seven), Parsons' was numbered the 10th Continental Foot, Huntington's the 17th, C. Webb's the 19th, Arnold's the 20th, and Wyllys's the 22d. They were known as such for that year only. Many changes were made among the company officers by the promotion of deserving subalterns and non-commissioned officers, to the advantage of the commands. With few exceptions all had been in service in '75. In the absence or loss of many of the rolls for '76, it is uncertain how far the soldiers of '75 re-enlisted for '76, but references indicate that a considerable number returned, who, with recruits, filled the new regiments to a respectable strength before spring. The Connecticut Assembly, at its December session, had resolved that those soldiers "who had or should enlist into the Continental army for the ensuing campaign, should be exempt from the poll tax on the list of 1776: and also that their bodies should be exempt from arrests for debts during their tour of service."

On Jan. 1, 1776, when the re-organized army began its new term, Washington issued the following order from Headquarters at Cambridge :

“(Parole, *The Congress*.)

(Countersign, *America*.)

This day giving Commencement to the new Army, which, in every point of view, is entirely Continental, the General flatters himself, that a laudable spirit of emulation will now take place, and pervade the whole of it. . . . His Excellency hopes, that the importance of the great cause we are engaged in, will be deeply impressed on every man's mind; and wishes it to be considered, that an army without order, regularity, and discipline, is no better than a commissioned mob. Let us therefore, when every thing dear and valuable to freemen is at stake, when our unnatural parent is threatening us with destruction from every quarter, endeavour, by all the skill and discipline in our power, to acquire that knowledge and conduct which is necessary in war. Our men are brave and good; men who, with pleasure it is observed, are addicted to fewer vices than are commonly found in armies. But, it is subordination and discipline (the life and soul of an army) which, next under Providence, is to make us formidable to our enemies, honourable in ourselves, and respected in the world.”

In the Northern Department no similar reorganization for '76 was effected. The Conference at Cambridge decided that “so much depended upon events and particularly upon the success of the present expedition against Canada (under Montgomery and Arnold) that no probable calculation” could be made as to the number of troops necessary in that quarter. The three Connecticut regiments — Wooster's, Hinman's, and Waterbury's, which, for various causes, had been greatly reduced in numbers, returned home in December. As events developed in Canada, however,—the “expedition” being defeated—Congress, late in '75 and early in '76, authorized the enlistment of two regiments from Connecticut to serve in that department for one year. They were commanded by Cols. Charles Burrall and Samuel Elmore. In May, '76, still another regiment was called for, under Col. Andrew Ward, which joined Washington in the summer. This completed Connecticut's quota of Continental troops for '76, the same number as in '75 — eight regiments.

Service.—The five regiments in the army before Boston remained there until the enemy evacuated the place in March. In April, they marched under Washington to New York, the next field of operations, and assisted in fortifying the city and vicinity. Col. Ward's joined them in August. Four of them were on the Brooklyn side at the time of the Battle of Long Island, Aug. 27, '76, and three more or less engaged. Huntington's lost heavily in prisoners. Two or three were caught in the panic of the troops on abandoning New York, Sept. 15th. All were with the army at White Plains, Oct. 28th, and one of them, Col. Webb's, closely engaged. Portions of three were at Trenton and Princeton. In the Northern Department, under Gen. Schuyler, Col. Burrall's regiment reinforced the troops before Quebec and afterwards took post at Ticonderoga. Col. Elmore's was stationed at old Fort Stanwix on the Mohawk, and vicinity.

Knowlton's Rangers and Bigelow's Art. Co.—These commands are noticed at the end of the regiments for 1776.

Reinforcements of State and Militia troops in 1776.—These are noticed with rosters under their proper heads after the Continentals. Three militia regiments were ordered to Boston in January. Two began fortifying New York in February–March, before the arrival of the Continental troops. In June–July, Gen. Wadsworth's brigade of seven regiments (six months' men) arrived and performed considerable service. In August–September, twelve militia regiments under Gen. Oliver Wolcott served several weeks, as well as nine more from the eastern counties of the State, under Gen. Saltonstall. A few “troops of horse” were also on the ground for brief terms. The militia, and the same proved true of those coming from other colonies, while temporarily swelling Washington's army, failed to add much to its efficiency—the men being generally poorly armed and undisciplined. Later, during the war, their service was more effective; on some occasions highly important.

The following rosters for '76 are arranged from original records in the State Library, Hartford, Department of State and Pension Bureau, Washington. D. C., the Trumbull papers, Massachusetts Historical Society, Boston, and from manuscripts in private hands, supplemented with the *American Archives*.

- ISRAEL PUTNAM,.....Of Pomfret. Cont. from '75 as Maj.-Gen. Continental Army. Served through the siege of Boston; instructed by Washington to proceed to New York in March, '76, in advance of the troops and superintend the construction of works; fixed his Hd. Qrs. at No. 1 Broadway and commanded a division of two N. Y. brigades, under Gens. Clinton and Scott; ordered, Aug. 24, to relieve Gen. Sullivan of the command of the troops on the Brooklyn lines and present at battle of Long Island Aug. 27. On the retreat from N. Y., Sept. 15, he conducted the last regiments in the city safely to upper part of the Island; on Sept. 16, engaged in the successful "affair" of Harlem Heights; present at White Plains Oct. 28; joined in the retreat through New Jersey and on Dec. 9 was sent by Washington to arrange for the defence of Philadelphia. After the battle of Princeton, Jan. 3, '77, he took post, with militia from Penn. and N. J., at Princeton, Amboy and elsewhere while Washington occupied Morristown.—Record cont. in '77, &c.
- JOSEPH SPENCER,.....Of East Haddam. Cont. from '75 as Brig.-Gen. Continental Army. Served through the siege of Boston and accompanied the troops to New York. Prom. Maj.-Gen., Aug. 9, '76, and given command of a division composed of Parsons' and Wadsworth Conn. brigades; present at L. I. at time of the battle, Aug. 27, half his division being engaged; present at White Plains Oct. 28; on Dec. 14 was ordered to the eastward and took command in R. I.—Record. cont. in '77.

BRIGADIER-GENERALS.

- DAVID WOOSTER,.....Of New Haven. Cont. from '75 as Brig.-Gen. Continental Army. Remained at Montreal until April 1, when he set out to assume command of the small force still besieging Quebec. Upon the arrival of Maj.-Gen. Thomas, ordered to the chief command in Canada, a council of officers voted to retreat from that position. Wooster returned with the troops and soon after was directed by Washington to repair to New Haven. He had been charged with incapacity, but demanding from Congress an investigation into his management of affairs in Canada, was acquitted of blame by that body. Retaining his commission as Continental Brigadier he was also re-appt. Maj.-Gen. of Conn. militia Oct. 23, '76, and in the latter capacity took post with a small State force on the Westchester border during the winter '76-'77.—Record cont. in '77, &c.
- BENEDICT ARNOLD,.....Of New Haven. Soon after the defeat before Quebec, or on Jan. 10, '76, Congress promoted Col. Arnold Brig.-Gen. Continental Army.² On the abandonment of Canada he repaired to New Haven and in the following summer again reported in the North. Dept. to Maj.-Gen. Gates who had succeeded Schuyler. Gates put Arnold in charge of naval matters on Lake Champlain and a fleet was built to meet that of the enemy who were then assuming the offensive in that quarter. On Oct. 11 an action took place off Valcour's Island resulting in defeat of the flotilla.—Record cont. in '77, &c.
- SAMUEL HOLDEN PARSONS, Of New London. As Col. of the 10th Cont. regt., Parsons marched with the army from Boston to New York in April, '76, and on Aug. 9 was prom. Brig.-Gen. Continental army. Commanded Spencer's old brigade of three Conn. and one Mass. regts. Ordered to the Brooklyn front on Aug. 24, he engaged in the battle of the 27th, being "field officer" for the day, and narrowly escaped capture. On the retreat from N. Y., Sept. 15, his brigade was swept along in the panic to Harlem Heights. After White Plains, he remained with the troops east of the Hudson.—Record cont. in '77.

AIDS-DE-CAMP AND BRIGADE-MAJORS.

- SAMUEL B. WEBB,.....Of Wethersfield. Cont. from '75, with rank of Major, as Aid to Gen. Putnam and accompanied him to New York in March, '76. There he was appt. in Gen. Orders June 21, Aid to Washington with rank of Lieut.-Col., and filled the position through the year. Present during campaign around New York at battles of L. I., White Plains, retreat through N. J., Trenton and Princeton.—Record cont. in '77 &c., as Continental Colonel.
- DANIEL PUTNAM,³.....Of Pomfret. First Lieut. in Durkee's Regt. Appt., A. D. C. to his father, Gen. Putnam, probably succeeding his brother, Maj. Israel Putnam, Jr.—Record cont. in '77.

NATHAN HALE.—One of the first published notices of Hale appears in the following extract from the *Boston Chronicle* as reprinted in the *London Remembrancer* in 1782. After noticing the consideration paid to André the writer proceeds:

"But while we pay the debt of humanity to our enemies, let us not forget what we owe to our friends. About four years ago, CAPT. HALE, an American officer, of a liberal education, younger than André, and equal to him in sense, fortitude, and every manly accomplishment, though without opportunities of being so highly polished, voluntarily went into the city of New York, with a view to serve his invaded country. He performed his part there with great capacity and address, but was accidentally discovered. In this trying circumstance he exhibited all the firmness of André, without the aid of a single countenance around him that spoke either respect or compassion, and though every thing that was said or done to him was adopted to make him feel that he was considered as a traitor and a rebel. André appeared great in not contesting the clear grounds upon which he was condemned, and in refusing to employ the absurd and frivolous pleas that Clinton would have put into his mouth. Hale, though not at all disconcerted, made no plea for himself, and firmly rejected the advantageous offers made him by the enemy upon condition of his entering into their service. André earnestly wished the *mode* of his death might have been more like that of a soldier; but consoled himself by observing, that in either way it would be 'but a moment's pang.' Hale, calm and collected, took no notice of either of those circumstances. André as he was going to die, with great presence of mind and the most engaging air, bowed to all around him, and returned the respect that had been and was still paid to him; and said: 'Gentleman, you will bear witness that I die with the firmness becoming a soldier.' Hale had received no such respects, and had none to return; but just before he expired, said, aloud: 'I am so satisfied with the cause in which I have engaged, that my only regret is, that I have not more lives than one to offer in its service.'"

COLONEL DURKEE'S REGIMENT, 1776.

[This regiment, known generally as Durkee's in the campaign of '76, was Gen. Putnam's Regt. of 1775 as reorganized for service in the Continental army for the year 1776. Benedict Arnold was its first appointed Colonel, but as stated below, he never assumed command. The regiment marched from Boston to New York in April '76, and was stationed until Sept. 15 at Bergen Heights and Paulus Hook, now Jersey City. Later it was ordered to Ft. Lee, opposite Ft. Washington, and then accompanied Washington on the retreat through New Jersey. Engaged at Battle of Trenton, Dec. 25, '76, and in part at Princeton, Jan. 3, '77, a portion of the regiment, at urgent request of Washington, continuing in service with other troops, about six weeks after expiration of their term. COLONEL ELMORE'S REGIMENT, 1776.

[This regiment was raised under authority of the Continental Congress, to serve for one year from April, 1776, and credited to Connecticut. The Colonel, Samuel Elmore, had served as Major of Hinman's Regt. in the Northern Dept. in 1775, and again as Lieut.-Col. of Wooster's provisional Regt. in the winter of '75-'76. Elmore and most of his company officers recruited their men in Connecticut and to some extent from the regiments that served in the North. Some of the officers belonged in New York and a few in Massachusetts, and men were recruited from both of those states. The regiment took the field in July, '76, under Schuyler, and on August 25th marched from Albany "into Tryon County." During the remainder of its term, it was posted at Ft. Stanwix and vicinity. It broke up at that point in the spring of '77, most of the officers and a number of the men re-entering the Continental service in the Conn., Mass., and N. Y. Lines. The following are the muster rolls of the companies as they stood on Jan. 13-15, 1777, "in Colonel Samuel Elmore's Battalion of Forces, raised in the state of Connecticut & now in the service of the United States of America."—*Rev. Rolls, Pension Bureau.*]

He had previously been appointed a Captain in the new army for '77, and upon his exchange presented himself for service, but no vacancy then existing he was regarded as a supernumerary and received pay and bounty as such. On June 21, '79, he was appointed Captain in a State Regt., to serve one year. He commanded a company of "Rangers" in the vicinity of Boston after the Lexington alarm. See p. 28.

Lieut. Joseph Hale (or Hall) is reported among the Connecticut officers taken prisoners at Ft. Washington, Nov. 16, '76, and exchanged during the war. Captain Nathan Hale had a brother Joseph Hale who was a Lieut. in Col. Andrew Ward's Regt. He may have been with the garrison in the fort and captured.

KNOWLTON'S "RANGERS," 1776.

AFTER the American defeat on Long Island, Aug. 27, '76, a small body of select troops was organized for special service along the lines and placed under the command of Lieut.-Col. Thomas Knowlton of Durkee's Conn. Regt. 20th Continental. Col. Knowlton, a veteran of the French and Indian war, had distinguished himself at Bunker Hill and in one or two subsequent exploits during the siege of Boston, and was peculiarly fitted to lead a partisan corps. The detachment in question, known as Knowlton's "Rangers," was composed of officers and men chosen from different regiments, to which they were to return when no longer needed. Knowlton appears to have selected officers whom he knew, which accounts for the large proportion from Connecticut; the men also were largely from the same state. The command was small, not over one hundred and thirty or forty. Its first service gave it no little reputation in the army. After the retreat from New York, Sept. 15, '76—the troops in general being more or less depressed—Washington ordered Knowlton to move out early on the 16th from Harlem Heights and ascertain the position of the enemy. Knowlton marched over Bloomingdale Heights, and found the enemy's outposts somewhere along the line of 110th St. on the main road, now Broadway. A skirmish occurred and Knowlton fell back to the American lines, then stretching along 125th St. from vicinity of 8th Avenue west to the Hudson. The British Light Infantry followed him. Washington thereupon directed Knowlton to attack again, turning their right, while other troops attacked them in front and left. A successful engagement followed, the enemy being driven back over the Bloomingdale grounds with loss. In the affair, Knowlton was mortally wounded, and died during the action, greatly regretted. In General Orders of Sept. 17, Washington referred to him as "the gallant and brave Col. Knowlton who would have been an honour to any country."

Knowlton's Senior Captain—Stephen Brown, of Woodstock—succeeded to the command of the "Rangers," but in a few days returned to his regiment—Durkee's. The other captains, so far as the records indicate, were Thomas Grosvenor, of Pomfret, and Nathan Hale, of Coventry. Grosvenor seems to have retired with Brown, and Hale, the "Martyr Spy," was then absent within the enemy's lines. As the next commander of the "Rangers," Washington appointed, Oct. 1, '76, Maj. Andrew Colburn, of Nixon's Mass. Regt. He was wounded before the end of the month and retired. The command devolved thereafter upon Lieut., afterwards Captain, Lemuel Holmes, of Sargeant's Mass. Regt. Upon the withdrawal of the army to White Plains and subsequently through New Jersey, it was proposed either to disband the "Rangers" or have them accompany the main force; but Col. Robert Magaw, of Pennsylvania, then commanding at Fort Washington, on New York Island below King's Bridge, urgently requested their continuance with him as being his main dependence for the security of his outposts. They accordingly remained on the Harlem lines until Nov. 16, 1776, when Fort Washington and the entire garrison were captured by the enemy.

The "Rangers" thus disappear as prisoners. Oliver Burnham, one of the detachment—afterwards Judge Burnham, of Conn.—writing after the war, says: "We remained until the sixteenth of November in this situation ("near Harlem") when we were warmly engaged on all sides. We were about two miles below the fort and well sustained the attack until the enemy made good their landing across Harlem River, when we had hard fighting to reach the fort. Just as we had reached the gate, the flag went out and surrendered the fort and ourselves prisoners of war."

It is worth while to note that the first three commanders of this corps fell in action during the war—Col. Knowlton at Harlem Heights; Capt. Brown at Ft. Mifflin, Penn., Nov. 16, '77; Maj. Colburn, as Lieut.-Col., at Saratoga, Sept. 19, '77. Capt. Holmes, the last in command, remained a prisoner two years.

The following roll of the "Rangers" is compiled from printed and Mss. records. The list of non-commissioned officers and privates is arranged from the papers of Capt. Lemuel Holmes, now in the Pension Bureau, Washington, and includes only the names of those who were captured with him at Ft. Washington. It doubtless represents the greater part of the original detachment.

BIGELOW'S ARTILLERY COMPANY, 1776.

[The first artillery company raised in Connecticut during the Revolution was an independent organization commanded by Capt. John Bigelow, of Hartford. It was recruited early in 1776 and marched to the Northern Department where it appears to have been accepted as a Continental Co. Stationed during the summer and fall of '76, at Ticonderoga and vicinity. In July Capt. Bigelow was sent by direction of Congress with a special flag of truce to Burgoyne in Canada. The original roll of the Co. not on file. The following represents one of its last returns, dated Nov. "Camp Ticonderoga," after some of the men must have been discharged. —*Rev. Rolls, Pension Bureau.*]

C.—REGIMENTS, "CONNECTICUT LINE."

FORMATION OF 1777—1781.

FOLLOWING the organizations of '75 and '76 came the most important of all, known in general as the "Continental Line," raised in 1777 and continuing with modifications to the close of the war. It passed, so far as the Connecticut troops were concerned, through four formations, the first of which is noticed under the present heading, C, covering the years 1777 to 1781.

ORGANIZATION.

Regiments of the "Connecticut Line."—The experiences of the first two years of the war, especially the failure in Canada and the defeats in the campaign around New York in '76, had demonstrated that the contest could not be successfully carried on with troops enlisted for short terms. The need of a permanent, disciplined army to cope with the British "regulars" was recognized as urgent. Congress, accordingly, by resolutions of Sept. 16th, 20th, and Oct. 8th, 1776, provided for such a body. The "establishment" of the current year would disband on Dec. 31, leaving the country practically at the mercy of the enemy should they be disposed to push a vigorous winter campaign. To take the place of this out-going force it was enacted that eighty-eight infantry regiments be raised for continuous service to the end of the war unless otherwise ordered. They were proportioned among the States according to their population. Thus, Massachusetts and Virginia were to furnish each fifteen regiments, Pennsylvania twelve, New York four, Maryland and Connecticut each eight, and the rest in like ratio. As a body they were to form a grand "Continental Line," and would, so far, resemble the "Regiments of the Line" in the British establishment. They differed from the latter, however, in this respect, that instead of being numbered consecutively in the main line the regiments of each State formed a sub-division by themselves and were numbered from the "First" to the "Fifth," or the "Eighth" or the "Fifteenth," and so on, as the case might be. Each State quota thus became a "Line" in itself, which was designated by its State name. Hence, the "Massachusetts Line," the "South Carolina Line," the "Connecticut Line," &c.,—each being a distinct body, commanded by officers from its own State, and cared for by its own State, as well as by Congress. Inspired by a common cause, and welded in homogeneous form under the leadership of Washington, it was these State "Lines," facing the enemy as a single "Continental Line," that were to bear the burden of the war for the next six years and bring it to a successful close.

The organization of this new army, as such, was to date from Jan. 1, 1777. The regiments were to consist of eight companies. Soldiers could enlist for one of two terms of service—either "for three years" or "during the war." The particular terms under which the recruiting was to be conducted were published as follows in the Connecticut papers of the day:

"RECRUITING INSTRUCTIONS

For

You are immediately to enlist into the service of the United States of America, all able-bodied men, who are willing to enter into the service, on the following terms, viz.:

First, You are not to enlist any but Freemen, able of body and under the age of fifty, carefully avoiding all persons laboring under lameness or other defects of body prejudicial to the service; if any such or boys are brought in, the officer inlisting them will be chargeable for the expence they may be to the public.

Secondly, You are not to enlist any deserters from the army of the king of Great Britain, or persons of a disaffected or suspicious character, the American service having suffered greatly by the desertion of such persons.

Thirdly, You are to enlist to serve three years, or during the continuance of the present war between Great Britain and the American States, unless sooner discharged by proper authority.

Fourthly, The men, by you enlisted, are to be subject to the rules and articles for the government of the army, published by the Congress the 20th of September, 1776, and are to sign those articles.

As an encouragement to such persons as shall enlist into the above service, you are authorized to engage, besides the pay and provisions now allowed,

First, That every soldier shall upon being approved by a Major General, a Brigadier General, or Colonel Commandant of a Brigade, and some Surgeon, be entitled to a Bounty of Twenty Dollars and a suit of clothes, which suit of clothes shall be given annually.

Secondly, He shall also be entitled to One Hundred Acres of Land at the expiration of his term of enlistment, and in case of his death, in the service, his representatives shall be entitled thereto.

When any person is enlisted you are as soon as convenient, to take him to some person duly authorized by the above articles, to administer the oath therein prescribed.

To encourage the brave and spirited to enter into the service, the General promises them all the plunder they shall take from the enemy, to be equally divided among the officers and men, according to their pay.

Given at Head Quarters, 17th day of Dec., 1776.

By His Excellency General WASHINGTON."

The Legislature of Connecticut added some further inducements, promising to increase the soldier's pay and provide the sick and wounded with "all necessaries for their comfort and relief."

The officers for this army were selected with care. This was expressly required by the resolutions of Congress. As these officers were to be nominated by their respective State authorities and then commissioned by Congress, several of the Legislatures sent committees to Washington's army of '76, before it disbanded, to confer with the General officers and others as to proper appointments. This was done by Connecticut with the result that, with a very few exceptions, no officers were appointed for the eight regiments of the State "Line" who had not seen previous service in '75 or '76. They were largely taken from the Continental regiments of '76 and from Wadsworth's Brigade of State troops which served for six months with those regiments. As to the enlisted men the incompleteness of the rolls of the eight regiments for '76 prevents any comparison which might show what proportion continued in the new regiments. But it is known that a large number re-enlisted.

The following notice, published by John Lawrence, Esq., the State Treasurer, indicates the pressure upon the State funds at this time :

"The Treasurer of the State of Connecticut hereby notifies all constables, and collectors of the Taxes due to this State, that he expects they respectively pay off their Arrearages; otherwise he shall be obliged to issue out his Warrants indiscriminately, against those who are delinquent. . . . The present Call for Money is so great, that notwithstanding some Taxes which are granted are not payable till May next; yet the Treasurer earnestly desires every Friend to this State to exert himself, and readily discharge said Rates, that he may be able to satisfy the generous Soldiers who have been in Defence of their Country, and likewise pay off the Battalions now raising for the same noble Purpose. Money is the Sinews of War—and to have a full Supply at this Juncture, is of the last Importance. Without Money it is impossible for us to raise a new Army, the absolute Necessity of which must be known to all. It is hoped that every one will so generously pay his Rates, and the Constables so speedily collect and settle them, that for the Future not a Single Order may be refused at this Office.

Treasury Office, January 27, 1777."

Additional Troops.—Congress, furthermore, called upon the States to recruit soldiers for the different arms, Cavalry, Artillery, &c., and also provided for the enlistment of what were known as the "additional" infantry regiments of this formation. Sixteen of these were authorized, but only thirteen were organized. Recruited at large, they came more or less under Washington's immediate supervision, and their field officers were in the main appointed by himself. Of these regiments Connecticut raised the one commanded by Washington's late aid-de-camp, Col. Samuel B. Webb, and out half of the one commanded by Col. Sherburne of Rhode Island, of which Return Jonathan Meigs was the first appointed Lieut.-Colonel. The State also contributed several companies, as appears by the rosters, to Col. Moses Hazen's regiment, sometimes called the "Canadian," recruited "at large," but not one of the sixteen mentioned above, and to Col. Seth Warner's regiment which was credited to the "Hampshire Grants." In addition companies were raised in the State for Col.

Jeduthan Baldwin's Regiment of "Artificers" and part of a company for Col. Flower's Artillery "Artificers." A majority of the men in the small but valuable corps of "Sappers and Miners" were from Connecticut, but they appear to have been detached from the regiments of the "Line."

Of the four Continental regiments of Cavalry or "Light Dragoons" raised at this time, the Second or Sheldon's was credited to Connecticut, though a few of the officers and men belonged to other States. Of the four Continental regiments of Artillery called for, the Second or Lamb's was raised largely in the State of New York. Connecticut's contribution to it consisted of the Lieut.-Colonel, Eleazer Oswald (see pp. 31, 91, n.), and four companies numbering in the aggregate one hundred and seventy men, or about one-quarter of the regimental strength. One company of Crane's First Artillery, mainly from Massachusetts, was commanded by Capt. Buckland of Hartford, and contained some of the men who originally belonged to Bigelow's Artillery Company of '76.

Inclusive of the several detachments named Connecticut's contribution to the "Continental Line" of '77-'81 consisted of about ten and a half regiments of infantry, one regiment of cavalry, and five companies of artillery.

RECORD FOR 1777.

The First Camps.—Gen. Putnam being in New Jersey during the winter and spring of '77. (after Trenton and Princeton), Gen. Wooster guarding the western end of the State, and Gens. Spencer and Arnold in Rhode Island, the business of organizing the "Connecticut Line" and pushing on the enlistments fell mainly to Gen. Parsons. By the 1st of April the recruiting had well progressed, and the men were ordered to assemble at given points and prepare to take the field. The several regiments they formed were commanded as follows during the next four years, the names of the Colonels being given as they succeeded each other by promotion :

In the fall of '80 Col. Samuel B. Webb's regiment was annexed to the "Connecticut Line" as the 9th Regt. The 1st Regt. during the greater part of '77 and '78 was known as Prentice's, that officer being its Lieut.-Colonel in command before Col. Starr took charge. The 8th Regt. also was known by the name of its Lieut.-Colonel, Mead, who commanded during the spring and summer of '78.

On April 14, '77, Gen. Parsons, in published orders, directed Huntington's and Durkee's regiments to rendezvous at Norwich, Wyllys's at Hartford, Douglas's at New Haven, Swift's at New Milford, Chas. Webb's, Bradley's, and Chandler's at Danbury, S. B. Webb's at Wethersfield, and Lieut.-Col. Meigs, with the half of Sherburne's regiment under his command, at Middletown. From these points the troops were ordered to march to Peekskill, N. Y., as soon as possible. On account of its central location on the Hudson, Peekskill had been designated as the encampment for nearly all the New England and New York troops then taking the field, and by the middle of July several brigades had assembled there. In the early part of the season Maj.-Gen. McDougall commanded at that point, but was relieved about July 1st by Maj.-Gen. Putnam. Nearly all the Connecticut infantry mentioned above, together with a few companies of Dragoons under Lieut.-Col. Blagden and of artillery under Lieut.-Col. Oswald reported at Peekskill during the summer. The regiments were assigned to brigades, but many changes were made, and it was not until a year later that the permanent organization of the "Connecticut Line" into one division of two brigades under Gens. Parsons and Huntington respectively, was effected.

Danbury Raid and Sag Harbor Expedition.—While the regiments were thus organizing and moving into camp, the enemy under Tryon attempted their expedition against Danbury, April 25–28, '77. Among the Continental officers present who led troops against them were Gen. Wooster, mortally wounded, Gen. Arnold, Col. Lamb, Col. Huntington, Col. Bradley, and others. The troops on the ground were mainly militia, but casualties are reported in Wylls's and Bradley's Continentals. The regiments of the "Line" appear not to have been available just at that time—a fact of which Tryon was doubtless aware. Some were at Peekskill and others scattered at points of rendezvous unarmed. The record of the militia under Gen. Silliman and others appears under its proper head.

Tryon's incursion was offset three weeks later by a dash made by Lieut.-Col. Meigs at the enemy's stores at Sag Harbor, L. I. Gen. Parsons having authorized and encouraged the expedition, Meigs selected one hundred and seventy men from the rendezvous at New Haven, and leaving Guilford on May 23d in thirteen whale boats, struck across the Sound, marched rapidly to Sag Harbor, burned twelve vessels and a large quantity of hay, took ninety prisoners, and returned without the loss of a man. Congress voted Col. Meigs a sword for his successful exploit. The Colonel as well as Gen. Parsons soon after reported in the field at Peekskill.

Brandywine and Germantown.—The campaign of '77 was inaugurated by the enemy. Burgoyne approaching from the North and Howe aiming at Philadelphia called for a cautious distribution of the American forces. As soon as the British plans were clearly developed the Peekskill camp was denuded of its troops. The New York and Massachusetts regiments were sent to Schuyler and Gates, and six of the nine Connecticut regiments with the two from Rhode Island were ordered at different times to Washington's main army in Pennsylvania. The Connecticut "Line" remained intact at Peekskill, engaging occasionally in expeditions towards King's Bridge, until after the American defeat at Brandywine, Sept. 11, '77, when Washington directed Putnam to send him reinforcements. Putnam at once dispatched Durkee's, Bradley's, Swift's, and Chandler's regiments, under Gen. McDougall, who duly reported to Washington. His command arrived in time to participate in the battle of Germantown, Oct. 4. It was assigned to Greene's Division on the left flank of the entire line, and in action encountered the enemy's Light Infantry. The course of the battle at this point appears to have been the same as at all points throughout the line. In the initial attack Washington gained ground, but the murky atmosphere and the unfortunate diversion at the Chew House compelled a retreat. One of the Connecticut officers, probably Chandler, reported the result to Gov. Trumbull very briefly thus :

"The retreat in general was safe and good. The army is now returned to the old encampment, our Brigade being on one of the flanks. As to the killed and wounded Returns are now making up; it will not exceed 500. For my Regt. 22 killed, &c., Durkee's & Swift's much short, Bradley's something more."—[*Trumbull Papers.*]

Gens. Varnum and Huntington were also ordered to Washington's army, but did not arrive until after the battle. They brought the Rhode Island regiments and the 1st Conn., then known as Prentice's. On the 16th of October, in rearranging the troops, Washington assigned McDougall to the command of the new division composed of Varnum's and Huntington's brigades, as follows :

Respecting the battle of Brandywine, preceding Germantown—no Eastern troops were at that time with Washington as separate corps. Major Tallmadge, with a detachment of the 2d Dragoons, had been moving with the army, but was not actively engaged on that occasion. The Connecticut company in Col. Moses Hazen's Regt. took part in the action, and its Captain, Jeremiah Parmelee, of New Haven, received a wound from the effects of which he died in the following spring. He had served in the Northern Department from the opening of the war. Several if not all the State's companies in Baldwin's corps of Artificers were also on the field.

Fort Mifflin, Mud Island, Penn.—After Germantown, Washington made an effort to command the Delaware below Philadelphia—the city being occupied by the enemy—and for a time succeeded. It furnished the occasion for a brave and spirited defence of the two American forts on opposite sides of the river. On the left bank Col. Greene, of Varnum's Brigade, repulsed the determined attack of Donop on Ft. Mercer. At Ft. Mifflin, Mud Island, on the right bank, Col. Smith, of Maryland, tenaciously held his ground against the overwhelming fire from the enemy's shipping. Exhaustion and a wound, however, compelled him to retire, and it also became necessary to relieve the greater part of the devoted garrison. It fell to Varnum's Brigade to furnish the relief, which consisted of detachments from Durkee's and Chandler's companies, under Lieut.-Col. Giles Russell of the latter regiment. This change took place on the 12th of November, '77. Russell, a veteran of four campaigns in the French and Indian war, in one of which he was wounded, and whom Varnum reports as a sensible and excellent officer, was "totally destitute of health," and soon requested to be relieved. Maj. Thayer, of Rhode Island, succeeded him as volunteer, and the garrison under his direction continued its remarkable defence under a still closer and more effective fire from the British ships. On the 16th, further resistance being out of the question, the ruined fort was abandoned. The Connecticut detachment, which bore the brunt of the bombardment, suffered seriously. "We have lost some gallant officers and men," wrote Gen. Huntington to Governor Trumbull, and he specially mentioned Capt. Stephen Brown, one of Knowlton's favorite officers in the "Rangers" of the previous year. This officer was killed by a round shot from one of the enemy's ships, and Capt. Nathan Stoddard, of Chandler's, suffered the same fate in a similar way.

Washington soon after withdrew towards Valley Forge.

Putnam on the Hudson.—The Burgoyne Campaign.—So many regiments had been ordered from the Peekskill camp to report to Gates on the upper Hudson or to Washington in Pennsylvania, that on Oct. 1, '77, Gen. Putnam had but one Continental brigade at his command. This was Parsons', which consisted of the three remaining regiments of the Connecticut "Line," namely, Wyllys's, Chas. Webb's, and Meigs', together with Samuel B. Webb's and Sherburne's "additional." A considerable body of militia was on its way from Connecticut to reinforce him.

The enemy under Sir Henry Clinton at New York moved up the Hudson in October to attempt the relief of Burgoyne. With his superior force and under cover of boats and shipping Clinton was able to deceive Putnam as to his line of advance—whether on the east or west side of the river—and by a rapid move attacked and captured Forts Clinton and Montgomery. Subsequently Kingston was burned. Putnam fell back, marching up the Hudson, and was prepared to interpose himself between Clinton and Gates, reinforcing the latter in case the former persisted in his original design. Clinton, however, returned to New York, and Putnam resumed his position at Peekskill. In the spring of '78 a Court of Inquiry, consisting of Gens. McDougall and Huntington and Col. Wigglesworth, of Mass., investigated the causes of the loss of the two forts mentioned above, and exonerated Gen. Putnam.

In the movements against Burgoyne no Continental infantry from Connecticut took part, her nine regiments having been engaged under Washington and Putnam. One company of Sheldon's Dragoons, under Capt. Thomas Y. Seymour, had been detached to Gen. Gates' force; otherwise Connecticut was represented on that field by militia, as noticed under that head. Two of the militia regiments—Cook's and Latmer's—did excellent service during the campaign.

Whitemarsh, Penn.—After Burgoyne's surrender Washington called for more troops from the northern camps. From Parsons' Connecticut Brigade Col. Chas. Webb's regiment was detached. It set out Nov. 14, '77, and on Dec. 8 engaged in a brisk action with enemy at Whitemarsh, Penn., in which two young Lieutenants and a number of men were killed and wounded. Not properly supported by the militia the few Continental troops were compelled to fall back, leaving the ground in the enemy's hands.

RECORD FOR 1778.

Winter at Valley Forge, '77-'78.—Col. Chas. Webb's Regt. appears to have been attached to Huntington's brigade, so that McDougall's Division as it went into quarters at Valley Forge consisted of the two Rhode Island regiments and the six regiments of the Connecticut "Line" commanded by Cols. Durkee, Bradley, Swift, Chandler, C. Webb, and the 1st Regt. under Lieut.-Col. Prentice. They remained with the main army through that memorable winter. The towns of the State sent some contributions of clothes, but the suffering of the soldiers was for a time extreme. As spring opened they recovered their spirits and fell to drilling under Steuben's new tactics.

Battle of Monmouth.—From Valley Forge Washington moved out in June '78 to follow the enemy in their withdrawal from Philadelphia to New York. Overtaking them near Monmouth Court House, N. J., June 28, he forced and won the well-known battle of that name. As a reminiscence of the victory there is preserved in MSS. the following order issued by Gen. Huntington to his own regiments on the morning of the engagement:

"Brigade Orders, June 28, above English Town where the Troops were formed to march to Freehold.

Officers & N. Com. off'r will speak to their men and make themselves known to their respective Commands. The men to observe their file Leaders, & right and left hand men that they may know their places.

Capt. Converse is to act, on the present occasion as assistant Brigade Major, & is to be obeyed accordingly.

The officers will as far as consistent with their particular commands, have regard to the commands of Superior officers & supply vacancies as may be needful.

Gen. Huntington has the fullest confidence in the Bravery and abilities of his officers and Men—doubts not they will preserve a cool & determined spirit, and confiding in the Justice of their cause, and in the God of Heaven, they will gain honor to themselves and their Country." [*Order Book N. Y. Hist. Soc.*]

Huntington's Brigade appears to have formed part of the main line after Lee's repulse, but the other brigade of the Division, Varnum's, which in Gen. Varnum's absence in R. I. was commanded by Col. Durkee, was pushed to the front. It engaged the enemy and in addition to losses in action became greatly exhausted through much marching and counter marching under Lee's orders. The heat of the day was excessive. Durkee was wounded in the hand and later in the day Lieut.-Col. Russell, of the 8th Regt., commanded the Brigade.

Camp at White Plains.—From Monmouth Washington moved to White Plains, N. Y., and encamped near Chatterton Hill and the old battle ground of '76. There he remained until late in the fall when the troops went into winter quarters at different points. At White Plains Washington was joined by all the Continental regiments stationed at West Point and along the Hudson under Putnam and Gates, and could thus present a powerful front. It was the largest force of regular troops brought together in a single encampment during the war—a veritable "Continental Line" composed of the greater part of the various "Lines" from New Hampshire to North Carolina, that of New Jersey excepted which was then stationed in its own State. The Rhode Island "Line" with Glover's Mass. and S. B. Webb's and the "additional" regiments were soon ordered to Rhode Island. With these omissions the White Plains army was arranged in the following

It was at this camp, White Plains, that the two Connecticut brigades were organized as they subsequently stood, until Jan. 1, 1781. The assignment of the regiments was as follows:

Battle of Rhode Island.—Major-Generals Greene, Sullivan, and Lafayette (Heath being then at Boston and Arnold commanding at Philadelphia) had been ordered with the troops to Rhode Island, and on Aug. 29, '78, fought a well-sustained battle with the enemy. Col. S. B. Webb's Connecticut Regt., under Lieut.-Col. Livingston and Maj. Huntington, and Sherburne's Regt., were among the commands immediately engaged.

Arrangement of Officers at White Plains, N. Y., '78.—Many disputes as to precedence in rank having arisen since the formation of the "Continental Line," Congress appointed a committee consisting of Messrs. Roger Sherman, Read, and Bannister, to repair to army headquarters and adjust the various claims. Orders were issued to all officers concerned to present their cases, those from Connecticut being notified as follows:

"White Plains, Aug. 29, '78.

Cols. Wyllys, Bradley, Swift, and Meigs are app^d to settle the relative Ranks of the Lt.-Cols., Majors & Captains in the Conn. Line. They are to meet at Col. Wyllys's marque at 3 o'clock this afternoon, and make their report to the committee of arrangements at Hd. Qrs."

This was known as the "Arrangement of Nov. 15, '78"—the various claims not being finally settled until that date. New commissions were issued under this arrangement, and in the case of the "Connecticut Line" the lists of the several regiments as prepared for Roger Sherman have been followed in the rosters of the first formation, '77-'81. No change was made in the regiments.

Winter Quarters at Redding.—Breaking up the grand camp at White Plains Washington distributed the troops into winter quarters. The greater part he stationed under his immediate command at Middlebrook, N. J. West Point was garrisoned by Massachusetts men. The Connecticut Division with the New Hampshire Brigade and Hazen's regiment took post at Redding. Under orders of Oct. 22, '78, the division was to leave White Plains the next morning at 7 o'clock under the Command of Maj.-Gen. McDougall. Nixon's Mass. brigade marched with it, but kept on to Hartford. On Oct. 25, the division reached New Milford and was directed to go into camp "in the woods of Benjamin Buckingham." It was called "Camp Second Hill," and there the troops remained until Nov. 19, when they marched to Redding. About Dec. 1 Gen. Putnam assumed command (Gen. McDougall going to Peekskill), and the division settled into log huts for the winter.

RECORD FOR 1779.

Redding. Putnam at Horseneck. Mutiny.—From the camp at Redding detachments were occasionally sent out to watch the enemy, and posts were kept up on the Sound. On Dec. 5, '78, Gen. Parsons is reported with a party at Horseneck and in Feb. '79 he was there again looking after the guards. In the latter part of the month Putnam was at the same place endeavoring to repel a superior force of the enemy under Tryon, and at this time occurred his famous ride down the stone steps at Horseneck. An authoritative account of this and other incidents of camp life at Redding appears in Humphreys' "Life of Putnam"—Humphreys being Putnam's Aid-de-camp at the time.

On the 30th of Dec. '78, the men of Gen. Huntington's Brigade assembled under arms, determined to march to Hartford and demand of the Legislature redress of grievances. Gen. Putnam

immediately rode down to their quarters and demanded by whose orders they were paraded. They replied that they had been suffering from want of blankets and clothes, that their pay was nothing, and that all engagements with them should be made good. Putnam addressed them kindly and firmly and they dispersed to their huts, remaining quiet through the season. Putnam's report of the affair, date Jan. '79, appears in the MSS. "Trumbull Papers."

In the Highlands.—In May '79, the Connecticut Division was ordered into the field on the Hudson, and early in June it encamped in the Highlands opposite West Point. Three strong works had been begun on high ground there known as the "North," "Middle," and "South" Redoubts on which the troops continued work. Maj.-Gen. Heath, of Massachusetts, was assigned to the Continental force on the east side of the river consisting of the Conn. "Line" and a division of Mass. troops under Gen. Robert Howe. Gen. Putnam had been assigned to the command of the right wing of the army, on the west side of the river, headquarters at Smith's Clove. It included the Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania Divisions. Before leaving quarters at Redding he issued the following order, May 27, '79:

"Maj. General Putnam being about to take command of one of the Wings of the Grand Army, before he leaves the Troops who have served under him the winter past, thinks it his Duty to Signify to them his entire approbation of their Regular and Soldier like Conduct, and wishes them (wherever they may happen to be out) a Successful and Glorious Campaign."

Tryon's Invasion of Connecticut.—On July 5, '79, Tryon began his depredations by attacking and "invading" New Haven and burning and pillaging the towns of Fairfield, Norwalk, and Greenwich. The defence of these places was left to the militia. When word, however, reached Washington he immediately ordered the Connecticut Division to march towards the coast with all possible speed and assist in repelling the enemy should they continue their ravages. Gen. Heath's orders on the occasion were as follows:

"AFTER DIVISION ORDERS,
MANDEVILLE'S, July 10, '79.

Genl. Parsons & Huntingtons Brigades are to be ready to march to morrow morning. If the heavy baggage is now in places of safety it is to be left, otherwise it is to be sent away to some place of security. The men are to draw two Days provision which they are to carry with them. The Commissarys will take on as much Bread, salt meat & flour as they have Teams to transport. The Brigade Q. M^{rs}. will arrange the Waggon agreeable to the Regulations & the Waggon Masters will see that they observe their order.—Genl Parsons' Brigade to strike, pack & load their tents as early as possible & move on & join Genl Huntingtons who are to remain at their present post ready to march when the junction is formed. The guards & Light Infantry to join their Respective Brigades at Reveille beating. The troops to march as little encumbered as possible."

The Division marched as directed; but Tryon having sailed off, it missed an opportunity of defending its own State. Detachments from Butler's and Wyllys's regiments in Parsons' leading Brigade skirmished with the enemy near Norwalk.

Storming of Stony Point.—Returning to its position on the Hudson, the Division was called upon for its proportion of companies for a Light Infantry Corps to be commanded by Gen. Anthony Wayne. This body was composed of four regiments of about four hundred officers and men each, all of whom were selected for special service. The Connecticut Division contributed one full regiment under Col. Return Jonathan Meigs, the Mass. Division another, and the right wing of the army, including the Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, and North Carolina troops, completed the other half of the Corps. On the night of July 15, '79, Wayne assaulted and carried Stony Point (which the enemy had occupied in May) with such skill, dash, and completeness as to win praises even from the enemy themselves. The British lost seven hundred prisoners, with many killed and wounded, while the casualties in Wayne's Corps were comparatively small. For the organization of Meigs' regiment and further details see roster toward the end of present formation of 1777-1781.

Camp "Robinson's Farm."—After demolishing the works, Wayne's Corps abandoned Stony Point, and not long after the enemy re-occupied the position. The American army remained as before in the vicinity of West Point. On the east side in Heath's wing the Connecticut Division was stationed at Camp "Robinson's Farm"—later the scene of Arnold's treason—and there the

troops continued work on the "North" and "Middle" redoubts, and engaged in daily drills. Some of the orders issued at this camp are of interest. Thus Division Orders for Aug. 20, '79:

"Brigadier Genl. Huntington directs that in future the Drum is not to beat on marching parties of Fatigue to or from Work, but that they march with Musick of the Fife only, as the Drum, tho' a noble Instrument of War like Musick, is designed more particularly for signals to Regulate duty and marches with arms."

Wing Orders, Mandeville's, Sept. 3, '79:

"Six men acquainted with blowing & splitting rocks are to be selected from the Connecticut Line for that service—they are to be daily employed in clearing the bomb proofs in the Middle & North redoubts until that business is Completed under the Superintendency of Capt. Starr of the 6th Conn^t Regt. who is appointed to that duty."

Maj. Throop and Capt. Eliphalet Holmes, of the 1st Regt., were detailed to superintend the works in general.

"October 21, 1779.

A subaltern & 20 men from the Conn^t Line to be ordered to the fatigue party under the Direction of Col. Kosciusko near St. Antonac Nose" . . .

Wing orders for Oct. 22d read as follows:

"It is with particular satisfaction the Major General [Heath] Beheld the Regularity & soldierlike behaviour of the Troops of the Connecticut Line at Exercise yesterday & he has the pleasure to acquaint them that the Baron Steuben the Inspector Genl. publicly acknowledged that they have made as great proficiency in performing the Exercise and manouvres as any Troops without exception in the Army.—A few things only Remain to be Learnt & practiced to make them finished Soldiers, & the Mag^r Genl. flatters himself that by the attention of the officers and ready obedience of the Soldiers these will soon be acquired."

Steuben, however, was a rigid disciplinarian, and on another occasion, in a formal report, he very sharply criticised nearly all the troops in the army, being as severe upon the Connecticut Division as any. Where praise was merited he gave it, as in the case of Col. S. B. Webb's Regt. which he had lately inspected in Rhode Island.

"This Regt.," he reports, "is divided into 7 comp^s & is too weak to form a batallion, the only fault I find with the Regt.—it being for the first Review the best in order of any Regt. in the Army. Their arms are a model. The officers take the greatest pains with their men. The Regt. marches perfectly, and has truly a military air. Maj^r Huntington who commands the Regt. deserves particular attention for the superior order in which he has kept the Regt. The officers have not yet received their Commissions & I cannot but interest myself for a Corps who have so eminently distinguished themselves."

Camp at Peekskill, '79.—About Oct. 21 the enemy destroyed and abandoned their posts at Stony and Verplanck's Points. The Connecticut Line was accordingly ordered to move down the river to the vicinity of King's Ferry which thus passed into American hands again. Maj. Walbridge, of the Second Regt., "with the village picket" was the first to re-occupy Verplanck's. The change of camp was made under Wing orders of Oct. 26:

"The Connecticut Division is to march early to morrow morning and encamp at below Peekskill. The Reveille to be considered as the General; the Assembly to beat at half past 8 o'clock in the 1st Brigade & the Brigade to march immediately.—The Assembly to beat at 9 o'clock in the 2nd Brigade and the Troops to march as soon as possible. The first Brigade will halt at the Village until the 2nd comes up when they are to join & march to their new camp in Division.

150 men properly officered are to be left under the command of Major Throop [Fourth Regt.] for the purpose of Completing the Redoubts on the Heights. The fascine parties are also to be left . . . Major Throop will endeavor to have the works Completed as soon as possible and report when they are finished."

Details from the Division under direction of Col. Gouvion, engineer, proceeded to repair the works evacuated by the enemy; the troops, also, in fitting up their new quarters levied on the straw of the neighborhood, calling forth Orders for the Second Brigade as follows, October 27:

"The commanding officer of the Brigade is very much surprised after repeated orders have been given against a wanton destruction of private property to have Complaints of that kind so soon after coming on the Ground. He does in the most pointed and positive manner forbid anything of the kind & is determined to punish every transgression of the kind with the utmost severity. Commanding officers of the Regts. are required immediately to make strict search in their respective Regiments for the article of wheat and confine every man with any found, and order the wheat back where it was taken."

For the 29th of October, Wing Orders read :

“General Parsons will please to order such guards & Picquets as may be necessary for the Security of the Camp between Verplank's point & the New Bridge on Croton River.

The Major General desires the exertions of the officers of all ranks to expedite the repairs of the works at the Points — they will soon be relieved on the West side of the river by other troops.

The Connecticut Division has made great proficiency in the exercise & manœuvres. — the Major Gen'l is anxious that they not only retain what they have already acquired but that they continue their endeavours to complete themselves in Discipline ; the exercise must therefore be daily attended by the troops off duty & if any Brigade cannot form a Battalion the two must join at some convenient place in the center. Lt. Col. Grosvenor will please to report what guards are mounted and where.”

Wing Orders, November 3, 1779 :

“Should it at any time be necessary while the Troops remain in their present encampment to make an alarm, it will be announced by the Discharge of three cannon which are to be fired by order of the Gen'l at such time Commanding on the Grounds. — If the order is given to the Commanding officer of Artillery in Gen'l Howe's Division he will turn the muzzle of the cannon toward the Conn't Division. In such Case the officer Commanding the Artillery in the first Conn't Brigade will repete the alarm by the Discharge of 3 Cannon. — Should the alarm be first fired in the Conn't Division it is to be repeated by Gen'l Howe's.

On the alarm being made the Troops will instantly parade completely ready for action, the waggoners put their horses to the waggons, and the whole be ready to execute such orders as may be given them.”

No boat is to pass down the River below Verplank's or Stony Point without a written pass signed by some General officer being on board.

The firing of Guns at game in the vicinity of Camp or in the river is strictly forbidden ; — the officers of all guards and Picquets and the officers Commanding the guard boats will see this order strictly observed.”

From Peekskill to Morristown, N. J. — As the season advanced the subject of Winter quarters engaged Washington's attention. He determined, as in the previous year, to station the greater part of his force in New Jersey, with brigades posted at West Point and the Highlands. The Connecticut Division, the whole or a portion of which had heretofore wintered east of the Hudson, was this season to encamp with the main army. In accordance with this arrangement orders were issued from Wing Head Quarters, November 17th and 18th, to break up camp at Peekskill and begin the march into New Jersey. Orders of the 18th were as follows :

“The Connecticut Division to move over Hudson's River to-morrow & Camp as near Stony Point as they can find good wood and water. While the army remains at Haverstraw they are to furnish the Captains Guard at the Ferry, and General Howe's Division the other.

This move to the west side of the Hudson was delayed until the 25th, when the Division crossed and encamped near Haverstraw. Gen. Heath remaining in the Highlands, the Division, with Gen. Parsons in command, came immediately under Washington's orders. On the 27th the Division encamped at night near Kakeat, on ground previously marked out by the Quartermasters. Parsons took up his quarters at Judge Cox's house. On the 28th the march was continued to Ramapough, and on the 29th and 30th to Persipanny. On December 1st orders read :

“The Division will march to-morrow morning to the grounds assigned for Winter quarters.”

Before marching from the Highlands, Washington issued the following order, dated “Head Quarters West Point, Nov. 19, 1779,” respecting the new winter quarters:

“Upon the arrival of the troops destined to quarter in New Jersey on the ground upon which they are to Hut, the space allotted for each Brigade will be pointed out by the Quarter Master Gen'l who will furnish a plan of the intended dimentions of the soldiers Huts, in the construction of which it is expected that a minute attention will be paid to the plan.



As conveyency, health and every good consequence will result from a perfect uniformity in the Camp, the Commander-in-Chief takes this previous opportunity of assuring that any hut not exactly conformable to the Plan or the least out of the line shall be pulled down and built again agreeable to the Model of this plan. The Commanding officers of Brigades will pay strict attention to this order.”

Winter-Quarters, Morristown. — The Connecticut Division was assigned to grounds below Morristown. A young Windham County schoolmaster, Ebenezer Fitch, describes the site as follows — date, Jan. 4, '80:

"Week before last I visited the camp, and had the pleasure of seeing many old and some dear friends. I found the Log-house city on the declivity of a high hill, three miles south of Morristown. There the Connecticut line dwells in tabernacles like Israel of old. And there the troops of the other States lie, some at a greater and some at a less distance among the hills in similar habitations."

Lieut.-Col. Sumner, of the Fourth Regiment, superintended the construction of the huts for the Division. The grand parade of the army was to be "in the field between the Pennsylvania & York encampments," and the following, under Washington's orders of December 17th, was to be regarded as the general line of battle :

Hut building, camp duties, and details, was the daily routine through December. On one day a sergeant and twelve men are sent to Pluckamin to cut wood for the Hospital ; again, a corporal's guard to the forage yard at Vealtown ; another to the White House to look after commissary stores, etc. How men were disciplined for minor offences in camp appears from the following regimental order issued by Capt. Brigham, then commanding the Eighth Regt., dated Dec. 31, 1779 :

"At a Regimental Court Martial held by order of Captⁿ Brigham Dec. 31 — Captⁿ Comstock Pres.^{dent} :— Tried James Foster & John Frame of Captⁿ Hodge's Co. for absenting themselves from Camp 2 days without Liberty :—

Plead guilty of being absent 2 Days but slept in camp each night.

The Court after considering their crime Do sentence them to receive 10 Lashes each on their naked Backs. But as Frame is now confin'd for his first offence, and the Court having a view to the Wound the Whip inflicts on the character of a young soldier do recommend it to the officer Commanding the Regt. to forgive him and remind him of the Evil consequences of such Company & Conduct.

The Com^{dant} Approves of the Judgment of the Court and Directs that y^e Part respecting James Foster be put in Execution this evening at Role Call. — But having the most tender feeling for the correction of a young soldier is induced to Pardon John Frame, But earnestly Recommends it to him in future to Shun all bad company and not be guilty of a like offence againe."

RECORD FOR 1780.

The Morristown Huts. Severe Winter.—Hardly had the troops completed their huts before a winter of unusual severity set in—the most trying experienced during the Revolution. It was long known as the famous winter of 1780, when cold, hunger, and want of clothing caused the greatest suffering among the troops. The distress is described in letters from camp. Major Huntington, of Col. S. B. Webb's Regiment, in Stark's Brigade on the second Line, writes under date of December 24, 1779 :

" . . . You will by the date perceive that we are in camp, tho' expect, if good weather, to have the men's Hutts so far compleated that they may go into them on Sunday or Monday. The officers' Hutts are not begun, nor will they be meddled with till after the men have finished theirs. The severity of the weather hath been such that the men have suffer'd much without shoes and stockings, and working half leg deep in snow. . . ."

Capt. Joseph Walker, of the same Regiment, writing under date February 6, 1780, says :

" . . . I left the Reg^t the 21st day of last month and am happy to say in much better circumstances at that time than they had been for weeks before. Our situation in regard to Provision was such I never wish to see again. Short commons ever ought to be avoided & when it cannot the consequences are to be dreaded in the army—that you know. However I can with pleasure inform you (& what I think will give you no small satisfaction), that the Lads bore it with the greatest patience and fortitude. We considered the severity of the season, the difficulty of transportation, and were willing to make all allowance possible.

"After our long march [from Peekskill] you may well think our men were rather destitute of cloathing ; after our arrival we began and completed our Hutts which destroyed our cloathing still more & to my certain knowledge we had not more than Fifty men in the Reg^t return^d fit for duty, — many a good Lad with nothing to cover him from his hips to his toes save his Blanket. . . ."

Assistant Commissary of Purchases, Royal Flint, described the situation as follows to Governor Trumbull :

"MORRISTOWN, Jan'y 6, 1780.

" . . . The distress of the army for several days past hardly admits of a description. It is a melancholy fact that the troops, both officers and men, have almost perished for want of provisions. In many instances the extremity has been so severe as to prompt them to commit depredations on the property of the inhabitants. This sudden calamity was occasioned by the early commencement and unusual rigor of the winter, attended by heavy and repeated falls of snow. By these obstructions transportation was so delayed that the magazines in the vicinity were exhausted before relief could be drawn from the more distant resources. In this unfortunate situation the Commander-in-Chief has been compelled to lay the Contiguous Country under a contribution, obliging the inhabitants to furnish a certain quantity of provisions within a special time. This expedient, however, is only to produce a temporary succour, and will cease its operation as soon as the ordinary channels of supply are open. I think there is a tolerable prospect of flour from the Southern States, but our principal dependence for meat, as heretofore, rests on Connecticut. As Col. Champion has expressed his fears of not continuing the supplies, I am persuaded your Legislature will consider a circumstance that merits their attention. The most material obstruction in his way is the want of cash, and I feel no probability of a speedy and adequate remedy to this evil from the Continental Treasury. I must therefore request your Excellency to represent our circumstances to your Legislature, and I am convinced they have both ability and inclination to adopt regulations suitable to our exigencies. Your state has exhibited too many proofs of its attachment to the army to make me doubt of its aid on the present occasion."

From Morristown to the Out-posts. Gen. St. Clair Commanding.—Toward the beginning of February Washington found it necessary to strengthen the "lines" or outposts in the vicinity of Elizabeth and Newark, and the Connecticut Brigades were detached for that duty. The first order they received, dated Headquarters, near Morristown, Feb. 1, 1780, read in brief:

"The Connecticut Division to be held in perfect readiness to march at the shortest notice."

The Division at this time was temporarily under the command of General Arthur St. Clair, of Pennsylvania, both Gens. Parsons and Huntington, with many other officers of the army, being absent sick or on furlough. St. Clair had for some time been in command of the advanced parties, and it was at his suggestion that a full Division was ordered down to reinforce him. The move to the outposts was made on February 3d under the following order of the 2d:

"The Division will march to-morrow morning at 7 o'clock with two days' Provisions Cook'd.—The Brigade Qr. Masters will provide *Carriages* to transport such baggage as may be necessary & apply to the Command^{rs} of Brigades for direction. A Subaltern from each Brigade to remain in Camp with those who are unable to march, to take charge of the Huts and such baggage as may be left."

On the 3d the Division was at Springfield—orders as follows:

"A Detachm^t from the Connec^t Line to parade to-morrow morning at Sunrise near the Meeting House with four Days Provisions. Maj. Throop will be the field officer of the Command."

Division orders, February 5th :

"The 1st Brigade will march to-morrow morning at 8 o'clock to Westfield—to parade at the Meeting House. Those men of the 2^d Brigade who have been on Command with Col. Gray & now at Westfield will join their Brigade at this Post. Camp Guards will be mounted this evening & Patrole the Streets & no Soldier to be out of Quarters after 9 o'clock. In case of an alarm the Troops will parade at the Meeting House."

Orders, Second Brigade, Colonel Isaac Sherman commanding, Westfield, N. J., February 5, 1780:

"In case of an Alarm the Troops will Parade at the Meeting House. It is desir'd that both officers & men be particularly attentive & that no one is absent from Quarters after 7 in the evening.

Till further orders, the Troops will lie upon their arms every night, Parade at 4 in the Morning & Continue Paraded till Sunrise in front of their Quarters. The Commission'd officers will Quarter Contiguous to the men & a N. C. officer with each particular squad at quarters.

To Parade this evening as soon as may be at Tremble's House below Esq^r Miller's ^o 1, ^s 1, ^s 1, ^c 2, ^r 24 to Reinforce the Guard at Raway; except a Corporal & 4 of them to be Posted on the Road between Raway & Westfield at James Norris's House; to Patroll for giving notice of an alarm: also a Corp^t & 6 men at John Little's Tavern to Patrole in front of the Troops Quarters towards Woodbridge & Amboy.

An officer to visit the quarters of the men at night & see that they comply with the above orders. The 8th Reg^t to keep a Centinel below Lt. Benton's Quarters to give notice in case of alarm."
